Reception Intake for September 2018

If your child is in Nursery and is due to move into Reception in September (if they were born between 1st September 2013 and 31st August 2014) you must apply for a place through the Local Authority at http://www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions. The deadline for applications is this Monday - 15th January 2018. Please note, places are allocated through the Local Authority and we cannot guarantee that if your child attends our Nursery that you will get a place in Reception. We do advise that you apply before the deadline, as failure to do so means you may not get any of your preferences.

Junior Choir Performing at the Gala Theatre, Durham – Tuesday 6th February 2018 at 6 p.m.

Our school is exceptionally fortunate to have been chosen to be one of only five schools in County Durham to take part in a mini-opera with Mahogany Operas. These 'snappy operas' have been written specifically for primary-aged children and are what their title suggests – short and snappy! Our school choir will be performing 'The Itch Witch' which is all about nits! The children will have three rehearsals in school before performing at the Gala Theatre on Tuesday 6th February at 6 p.m. Tickets are now available for the performance and are £4 (£2 concessions) and are available from Gala Theatre box office www.galadurham.co.uk 03000 266 600. It is likely to be a very popular event so if parents are wanting to go, I strongly suggest purchasing tickets soon.

Foundation Stage News (Nursery and Reception)

In Nursery, we have had a great first week, both for our returners and our new starters. Over the next week or so, we will be making some changes to our groups to accommodate our new children and to support some developing friendships. We will have an additional family group, the Meerkats, who will be led by Mrs Sharron Davis. We will let you know which group your child will be in as soon as we have settled back into a good routine. Over the next week, we will also be changing the story groups so you may find you will be collecting your child from a different place in Nursery at the end of the day. Please bear with us throughout these changes. Our aim is to be as consistent as possible and to create routines which support the children's well-being as best we can, so any changes we make are carefully considered.

Over the next term, we are planning to visit Lanchester Library with the Nursery children in their family groups. The first group to visit will be the Flamingo Group on Thursday 25th of January, leaving Nursery at 9.30 am and returning by 10.30 am. If you are able to accompany us on this visit, please let a member of the Nursery Staff know.

Please remember to let us know about your child's WOW moments. WOW slips are freely available in both Nursery and Reception classrooms. The children get such a boost from sharing their special moments with their teachers and friends.

We are always looking for ways to raise the profile of reading and story in the Early Years. If you might be interested in coming in to Nursery or Reception on a one-off basis as a 'Surprise Storyteller' we would love to hear from you. If you want to know more, please pop into Nursery and have a chat with Miss Butler.

Nursery stories next week will be 'Goldilocks and the Three Potties', 'Duck in the Truck', 'Chicken Licken', 'Paper Dolls' and 'One Winter's Day', and our songs for next week are 'Marching Monday' and 'When I look around' by our absolute favourites, Tiny Tweeties. In Reception, the children will be doing lots of work around 'The Mitten'.

A final reminder: our cloakroom areas are still very congested. Please do not send your child to school with a backpack, as there is not room for them to hang on the coat pegs and still allow their classmates to hang up their coats. A simple drawstring bag is just perfect for their spare clothes/wellies.
