Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope the children are now well and truly settled into school again – they certainly all seem very happy and I don't think we have ever had such great Nursery and Reception children. Hardy a tear in sight – just smiles all round!

### **Extension**

You may have noticed some visitors on site at home time on Wednesday this week. I invited the Project Manager of the new extension and a Health and Safety representative on site to see for themselves the congestion we are experiencing at the end of the school day. I have asked for more of the area to be tarmacked, especially the two patches of grass where the children come out, which would just give us a little more space. Of course, as usual, it all comes down to money, but I think they were certainly surprised to see for themselves the number of children and parents on site at one time. Hopefully I shall have some good news for you soon regarding this.

### **Eligibility for Free School Meals**

Although Reception and KS1 children do not pay for school meals, there is still an important eligibility check that we can complete on your behalf to see whether your child meets the criteria for Pupil Premium Funding. All children who meet the criteria bring additional funding into school (£1,320 per pupil) which means that we can help to fund residentials, music tuition and additional support in school for these children. The attached form has all the key information needed. Please read this and complete the details on the form and we can contact the Local Authority who will find out whether or not you are eligible. This really does make a huge difference to the provision in school – last year we received an additional £80,000 into our school budget. However, this is only because parents have applied in the past. Please help us!

### **Sal's Shoes Collection**

A huge thank you to all parents who very kindly donated their children's old school shoes at the end of last term. Lisa Lewis (James' mum from Year 1) organised the collection of the shoes and was quite overwhelmed with 165 pairs of donated shoes!
