This term has to be one of the best times to work in a school. The anticipation of Christmas is just lovely to witness in the children and Santa Claus has already confirmed that he can fit a visit to our school into his busy schedule. He can come to both our school fair and Christmas parties, which is great news for us all! I am sure you will soon start to hear some of the nativity songs being sung at home too – it never ceases to amaze me how quickly the children pick up the new songs!

We are also expecting our SIAMs (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) inspection this half term. It is almost five years since we were last inspected so we are certainly due a visit. For this, there are three questions the inspectors will ask, find evidence of and report on:

- 1. How well the school, through its distinctive Christian character, meets the needs of all learners?
- 2. What is the impact of Collective Worship on the whole school community?
- 3. How effective are the Leadership and Management of the school as a Church School?

We are also expecting our Ofsted inspection soon. It is just over 4 years since we were inspected and know that the call could come any time. We are informed the day before the inspectors come into school. Part of their inspection is looking at parents' opinions and comments about the school. If you haven't done so already, it would be really helpful to us if you could log onto ParentView and complete the parent questionnaire on there. (Please note – you need to input the full name of our school-Lanchester Endowed Parochial Primary School). Many thanks.




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# Rights Respecting Schools

Next week we will be taking part in OutRight 2017 and speaking out about children's rights on World Children's Day, 20th November. OutRight is a campaign for children, by children, that helps to promote and protect children's rights in the UK and around the world. This year the campaign is focused on the rights of refugee children - especially their right to protection and be with their family. By taking part in the campaign our children will develop their knowledge and understanding of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child; learn about the impact of the refugee crisis and have the opportunity to express their views on children's rights. This will be led by our Rights Respecting School Ambassadors who will be presenting various activities in Class Assemblies.


# **School Council**

On Monday and Tuesday this week, we were privileged to welcome 33 visitors from 9 European countries to Lanchester. They were attending as we launched two joint projects that we will work on over the next few years, funded by the British Council as part of the EU's Erasmus+ project.

First, our visitors were treated to a very special assembly presented by some of our Y5 children, who impressed everyone with their language skills! Our guests then spent time in our classrooms and were very impressed by how hardworking, polite and respectful our children were. For the rest of their visit, they worked with members of our staff to decide how exactly our projects will work. We cannot reveal all the details just yet, but there will be a very high-profile launch of one of the projects very soon. Keep an eye out for some strange goings-on!

As with previous projects, there will be opportunities for some of our Year 5 children to travel to our partner schools, including a visit to Hungary in March and then to Sicily in Italy next April. Some Italian and Hungarian children will also be joining us in school for our Fun and Fitness Week at the end of May. There will be more information about this in the coming weeks. However, we are really looking forward to further developing our European links and hope that the children will be able to make some life-long European friends.

#### **Junior Choir**

Congratulations to the KS2 choir! They recently entered a competition for County Durham
Primary School Choirs. After only a couple of lunchtime rehearsals, a video performance
was recorded of them singing the Gary Barlow & Andrew Lloyd Webber song called 'Sing'. The children impressed the judges and have been selected to take part in the next round of the competition.

They will be one of ten choirs from County Durham singing at Ushaw College on Thursday 7th December 2017. It should be a fabulous day for them all. They will spend the morning learning new songs and after lunch each school will perform their Christmas song. I am sure they will have a great day and I look forward to hearing their final performance.

### **Sport in School**

Our PE and Sports Clubs are just as busy this half term, with a range of different clubs and activities on offer. We have linked up with Durham County Cricket Club and they are working with our Year 3 classes for PE whilst also providing an after school club for Year 4 and Year 5. We have continued our strong relationship with SAFC who are providing high quality PE lessons twice a week and an after school club for Year 2.

#### **Girls' Football Team**

The girls' football team completed their league fixtures and for the second year running finished second, just behind the winners - Shotley Bridge. The team had an excellent record, finishing with 10 wins and 2 draws from 12 games, meaning it is now over two years since they lost a competitive match! What was particularly impressive is that they did not concede a single goal in the whole league campaign - that has to be some sort of record! The good news is that the team have qualified for the Champions League in the Spring Term, defending the trophy that they won last year.

#### **Netball**

The Autumn term has seen a huge interest in netball, so much so that we had to put on an extra night to cater for the large numbers. Mrs Smith and Miss Martin now run a Monday After School Netball club for Years 3&4 and Mrs Smith and Mrs Grieve take the Year 5&6 children on a Thursday. All the children have been working so hard on their netball skills and we are constantly amazed at the talent we have in Lanchester EP. A number of our girls now also play for Consett Cinders on a Saturday morning in the Durham Netball League.

It is the time of the year now when the evenings are too dark to play outdoors and Mrs Smith is in the process of putting together a small league with a number of local schools to give the children the opportunity of playing against different teams in readiness for the Netball Leagues which begin next year. We are hoping to play these matches at St Bede's, details of which will be given as soon as they are finalised.

# **Christmas Cards**



I am sure many of you will already be aware of the very sad death of Lucia Smith, aged 9, earlier this year. Lucia was the sister of Archie in Year 3 and she was an amazing girl with a terrific strength of character. Archie has written to a number of organisations to ask whether they would be willing to raise money in her memory. So, on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December we are asking the children, staff and adults to come to school dressed in their pyjamas (Archie's idea!) in exchange for £1 donation. All donations will be split between the charity, 'Bethany's Wish' - a special fund within the Children's Cancer and Leukaemia Group (CCLG), which funds vital research into Wilms tumours - as well as The Sick Children's Trust who provide free accommodation for families with children in hospital. I am sure you will agree that this is an exceptionally worthwhile cause and one that is very close to our hearts.

However, if we do this for one family, we would have to do it for all and obviously this is just not possible.
