### Parents' Evenings

We have decided to hold traditional face to face parents' evenings this half-term as we are aware it has now been 2 years since you have been able to come into school and see your child's work. We also send out quite comprehensive end of year reports next half term so felt that it was more important that you had the opportunity to talk this half term. As there will be a number of you in school at the same time, we would ask that you wear a mask on this occasion please, just to help protect everyone!

These will be held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> May. They will start at 3.30pm to allow the staff to have a short break and all meetings will be held in the Junior Hall with work being left in the classrooms. You will have the opportunity to see your child's work either before or after your appointment with your child's teacher. However, it will be really important that we are quite strict with our timings of ten minutes. Please do not be offended if your child's teacher puts a stop watch on – they are not being rude – it is just important that we do not over-run in a bid to avoid too many parents in the hall at the same time. The appointments will go on eSchools on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> May from 12 noon.

# Musical – One Sun, One World The children have started to learn the first song this week and what a fantastic sound they

made! They really are extraordinary singers. This is really going to be a very special event with two performances at 6pm on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> July in Consett Empire Theatre. Hopefully, you will soon begin to hear these songs sung at home! This will form part of the curriculum next half term and if our last productions are anything to go by, will be a very exciting time for

All classes will have different roles (the most exciting one being the rats!) and they will be told over the next few weeks what they will be. We will be making all our own costumes and scenery but we may be asking for a little help from home too.

There are a small number of solo and group parts for this as well as a number of narration roles. We will be auditioning for these during the week beginning Monday 16<sup>th</sup> May. The children will be reminded of those dates and they will also be told what we would like them to prepare in advance of the audition.

Tickets will go on sale for this after half term. We will try to ensure the ticket prices are as low as possible, but obviously we do have to ensure that we cover the costs of hiring the theatre.

### **Forthcoming Statutory Tests**

We have a lot of year groups taking various 'tests' over the coming weeks and it is a very important time for the school. We aim to keep them all as low key as possible for the children but these tests are important for the school as they are what the school gets 'judged' on. This year, I feel it is going to be even tougher for the children as they have missed so much school due to the pandemic and whilst we have been working hard to 'catch up' academically in all year groups, we have felt that it has been equally important, if not more so, to ensure their well-being and mental health have been prioritised.

#### **Year 6 Tests**

The week beginning Monday 9<sup>th</sup> May it is absolutely essential for ALL Year 6 children to be in school as they will take their KS2 Statutory Tests. We ask that they come into school at 8.15am that week to enjoy a special breakfast each day, prior to them taking the tests. They have already been more than forthcoming with their requests for food so please don't worry about them not eating much! Our aim is to see them come racing into school more worried about what treat they will have for breakfast that day, than which test they are having.

For those Year 6 parents who missed the meeting, we will put the presentation on the website but here is the timetable for the week. Please note that when they are not taking a test, they will be having fun 'helping' in Early Years or enjoying some time outside.

### **Year 2 Statutory Tests**

Our Year 2 children also have their statutory tests during May. However, we do not and will not be talking to them about these as we just do them as part of a 'normal' school day. They will know them as 'quizzes' and we will never refer to them as a test to the children. They have to do these to support our teacher assessment and are a government requirement. We will be asking children to complete these in small groups at different times during May and they will not be aware that they have done one. Therefore, we ask parents not to talk to them about 'tests' but we felt it was important that you are aware of them taking place.

### **Year 1 Phonics Screening and Year 4 Multiplication Test**

These children will be taking these during the first half of June, after half term and again, it is essential that children are in school for these. They are just part of a normal day with our Year 1 children and again, they will be oblivious to having taken them. Packs are being sent home with the children for them to practise over the coming weeks so please give these a go and have some fun with your children at the same time!

Year 4 have been doing some practice tests in small groups and they too will just take these in small groups.

All test results will be reported to parents with the end of year reports.

#### **History Hero Day**

Do you have a famous character from the past that you really admire?

In our history lessons, we often find out about significant dates and important events, but what about the people who have changed the world throughout history that were just normal people like you or me?

Well, on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> May, we are going to celebrate each and every one of them. All you have to do is choose your favourite character from history and come to school dressed as that person. You will also need to know roughly when that person was alive because we are going to create a 'Whole School Historical Timeline' by ordering our characters chronologically.

So get your thinking caps on and let's all be a History Hero for the day!

#### **School Office Information**

If your child attends any wrap around care clubs held in school and you would like to continue to access them in the summer term, any outstanding amounts must be settled by Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2022. Please also make sure that if you want your child to go to the wrap around care you book on in advance, either via ParentPay or through the school office. Thank you.

We would also like to politely remind you that all dinner money accounts must be kept up to date and ideally at least one week in advance in credit. If you would like to make any changes to your child's menu, we also ask for at least one week's notice. Thank you.

If you are a parent of a new starter with us, your ParentPay login will be provided once your child has started with us. This may take up to 3 days from their start date. However, please be assured that this does not impact their meals or attendance at any wrap around care clubs. If after 7 days you have not received the information, please contact the school office.

### **Sports Days**

These are going to take a slightly different format to previous years. In the mornings, we will be holding House Team Games and this will be followed in the afternoons with the traditional Sports Days with a carousel of activities for all children including the competitive races too. Parents will be warmly welcomed to watch the Sports Days in the afternoons but the House Games in the morning will just be completed ourselves.

### Tuesday 24th May - Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 Sports Day

All children will be grouped into teams across the year groups for the morning and the children will compete in different team games in their four houses.

The official Sports Day will begin at 1.30pm on Tuesday Afternoon. Parents are welcome to come and watch and entry will be through the gate at the side of the MUGA.

### Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> May – Years 3 – 6 Sports Day

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Again, children across Key Stage 2 will be competing in a variety of team games in their four houses. Their official Sports Day will begin at 1.30pm on Wednesday afternoon. Parents are once again, welcome to come and watch with entry also through the gate at the side of the MUGA.

During the final two weeks of this half-term, we will be celebrating the Queens' Platinum Jubilee with a number of different classroom-based activities. We really think that it is a wonderful chance to not only celebrate her Majesty's milestone, but to have another successful community event; hopefully in the sunshine! We look forward to seeing you there!

On Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June, there is also a large community picnic is being organised which is going to take place in our school grounds. This is not organised by the school, but obviously families will be more than welcome to take part. We expect to have more information sent to school in the coming weeks.

This will be a traditional fair like we have had in the past with a mixture of stalls, rides, hot dogs, games and refreshments. Our Nursery children will be visiting Hall Hill Farm on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> of May as part of school's Fun and Fitness Week. We would like to invite 10 parent volun-

If we have more than 10 parent volunteers, we will draw names out of a hat, but parents will be more than welcome to join us at the farm if they would like to. There will be an email sent out to parents to confirm which day your child will be going and the itinerary of the day closer to the time. This trip is only for the children who have been with us since September (the January intake and March intake of children will have the opportunity to go next year).

### The Big Breaktime

On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> June all classes from Reception to Year 6 will enjoy 'The Big Breaktime' which is an hour of play for staff and children to enjoy while raising money for NSPCC and Henry Dancer Days. If the weather is good, staff and children will be playing outside together in a variety of ball games and other games chosen by the children. If it is wet, we will all be playing a variety of board games with the children for an hour.

Play is very important for our children and it is so important to model play to the children. This will be an invaluable hour for us all whilst also raising money for two very good causes.

### **Earth Day**

Eco Rangers organised Earth Day in school which involved switching off all electrical appliances for one afternoon. They made attractive posters to put around school to promote this event. The week before, they carried out an audit in every area of school, to see where we can save energy. As a result of this, we are going to ensure that interactive whiteboards are switched off when not in use and lights are turned off in empty classrooms and areas.

### **Year 6 Leavers' Events**

A letter will be sent to all Year 6 parents and carers about the lovely events that we have planned for them during their final term with us. Please make a note of all the dates as there will be a lot going on for them all! The most important thing in their eyes is ordering their leavers' hoodies so please make sure this is received in good time (the children have already tried on the samples in school, so we have the details of the sizes that need to be ordered).

### **Erasmus+ Visits**

This week has been the final visit of this academic year. We have had 7 Erasmus Visits this year which has been quite challenging staffing wise, especially due to the number of absences we have had due to Covid, but obviously it is due to none taking place over the last two years. Visits to Poland, Portugal, Germany, Denmark, Madrid and two to ourselves has made for a very busy but exciting year. Thankfully, these have now all finished until next academic year.

These visits are a mixture of teacher-training events and student mobilities. The staff who have had the opportunity to go on these visits gain so much from them, return to school with renewed enthusiasm and ideas as they are an invaluable form of CPD. The children who have been on the visits gain so much confidence, resilience and cultural awareness – visiting schools in a different country, gaining friendships and seeing 'real life' away from the tourist areas.

This week has brought our project about 'Learning Outdoors, Learning for Life' to a close. It has been amazing to glean so many new ideas and initiatives and I have been asked to speak at a conference next month about our experiences from this.

Next year we will, once again, have a number of visits as we will be in our final year for our 'Happy Mind, Happy Life' and 'European Tunes for Peer Bullying' projects. Visits to Latvia, Hungary, Turkey, Greece, Brussels and Spain will once again mean that we have another very busy year. Children from Year 5 & 6 will

have the opportunity to travel again.

Our first visit is in October to Latvia and letters will be sent to Year 5 in the next week to see which parents are interested in their children travelling to our partner school there.

These are opportunities that children (and staff) may never have again as once these two projects finish in summer 2023, we are unable to apply for anymore due to Brexit. We have been involved in these every single year since 2010 so it really is a huge shame.

#### **Proprioceptive Activities**

Information

Many children in school are working on developing their proprioception skills. Proprioception is feedback from our muscles and joints. It helps children know where their bodies are in space and how much force is required to complete a task, e.g. whether they walk gently or by stomping. Children may seek out proprioceptive sensory input in order to enable them to feel calm and emotionally regulated. The picture below has some excellent ideas to help children with developing their proprioceptive skills:
