Dear Parents and Carers,

The children from Years 1-6 all had a wonderful afternoon at Chitty Chitty Bang Bang yesterday afternoon. I have never heard 300 children be so quiet and attentive – they certainly seemed to be totally engrossed in the show! It is always hard to anticipate when we will be back after such shows as we never know what the traffic will be like. Yesterday, the traffic was very heavy as well as there being an accident which resulted in hold ups on the roads, consequently delaying our return to school on time. I do apologise for any inconvenience caused.

It was also rather busy dismissing the children on our return – I think in future, we will ask parents to stand further back from the main school entrance which will enable us to line the children up and dismiss them from their lines in the middle of the yard.

Can we also please remind parents that there are a lot of nasty bugs going around at the moment? Please remember that children in Nursery and Reception are very active during their time with us and will spend a large part of the day outdoors. If you feel that they are unwell and unable to participate in our normal activities, please give them time to rest and get better.
