Dear Parents and Carers,

### Early Years News

We are very pleased to welcome our new starters to Nursery and hope that they settle quickly and enjoy their time with us. A huge welcome also to all our new families. We are delighted that you chose to send your children to us to begin their school career.

Can all of our EYFS parents please check that you have confirmed your email for our online learning journal, Evidence Me. For new parents, we will be setting this up over the next fortnight so that you can receive updates about your child's achievements and experiences during their time with us in Nursery and Reception. Reception children will be bringing home a new set of letters for their word-building pack in the next day or so. If you could cut them up and put them in your child's word wallet, that would be a huge help. We are including the digraphs 'sh', 'ch', th' and 'qu' this time, which a lot of the children are finding quite tricky. We will be revising these sounds over the next week before moving on again with new sounds. The Reception children are making great progress in their reading, so thank you for your help and support with this! As always, if you have any questions, please feel you can ask a member of staff or email us.

As part of 'Understanding the World', children need to find out about different occupations. If you or a family member would like to come in and talk to a small group of children about your job or hobby, we would love to welcome you in to school. Please let us know if you might be interested!

We have had a number of named clothing items go missing over the past few weeks. Could you please check that you have no coats/school sweatshirts with another child's name in them, please, we appreciate that it is exasperating to lose a named article of clothing and would love to reunite the lost ones with their owners!

### <u>Pick Up Time</u>

Obviously at the end of the school day, the roads and estates do become quite congested with cars when parents/carers are collecting children from school. With so many cars around, the air can become quite polluted if engines are left running. This is bad, both for the air quality and it can also be dangerous, especially for those with asthma. Please can we ask that engines are switched off when you are waiting for your children to try and help prevent any such issues. Thank you.

#### Children and Road Safety

We have had a resident contact us to express their concern at some of our older children 'playing' in the middle of the bypass road where the crossing patrol normally stands. Apparently they have been jumping into the road and even doing star jumps. Obviously this is highly dangerous. We have talked to the children but also ask that you take this opportunity to reiterate road safety to your child – especially if they do cross that road on an evening. Thank you.

### Collecting from Early Years After School Club

Please look out for a bell on the door of the entrance to Early Years. When it is dark on an evening, it is impossible to see outside and some parents have experienced difficulties in collecting their children. To help alleviate these issues, we will be installing a doorbell – please look out for this and use it when collecting your children from Early Years After School Club. Thank you.

Please make sure you check your junk/spam box. If they have not dropped in there, please contact the office so that we can check that we have the correct email address for you.
