Fundraising Events & Collections

We would like to say a huge thank you for your amazing generosity to all of our recent fundraising events. The rainbow collage that we sold in aid of the NHS made a fantastic £789. This has now been paid to 'NHS Charities Together' and I am sure will be very appreciated in these difficult times.

I would like to say another thank you to Josh, who is now in Year 6, who suggested that we donate it to this worthy cause – he should be proud of himself for such a lovely, kind idea.

We made more than ever for our Poppy Appeal raising an incredible £502. This is almost double the amount we have raised in the past so thank you all so much. Obviously it is for an incredibly important cause.

Children in Need Day was enjoyed by us all last Friday – it was rather nice wearing our pyjamas for the day! Again, we raised £484 for this really worthy cause which is more than usual too. Thank you so much for your generosity during these very difficult times!

The final day for our homeless appeal is today and we have been totally blown away by the number of donations we have received. Our meeting room is almost inaccessible because of all the items you have brought in for us. It really is remarkable how our school community can always be counted on to rally together and support those less fortunate than ourselves and I think this is the best demonstration of our school values and the ethos that underpins everything we do in school. Thank you. Our Year 6 children will be sorting and delivering those next week.

Book Fair in School All Week

Next week we have our Travelling Book Fair in school for the week. Obviously, this year, it will operate very differently to how we have had it in the past. Attached to this letter is a brochure and order form – this is just an electronic version of the leaflet that has usually been sent home with the children.

This year, the children will not be able to visit the book fair in their classes or with parents. Instead, each teacher will take a selection of books to their classrooms which are age appropriate for that class and talk

about all the books which are available. All books are included on the brochure/order form which you have all been emailed for you to peruse at your leisure.

The order form then needs to be completed, placed in an envelope with the cash or cheque and brought into school with your child. This needs to be handed over to the teacher or into the school office and the books will then be given to your child. Payment can either be made by cheque or cash or there is also an option to pay over the phone – the school ID is on the order form. However, we would recommend NOT using the gift vouchers as there is no change available with those and you will end up losing money. **Please note we have no money in school since we have moved to being cashless, therefore you MUST send in correct money as we have NO change in school at all.**

School can gain up to 60% in commission from these book fairs so they are a really good way of raising valuable funds for school. We re-stock our class libraries every year with the commission made from these book fairs so thank you for supporting it!

Well-Being Week

We are very aware that the children have had a very strange and difficult few months this year and are conscious that we need to care for their well-being as much as their academic needs. With this in mind, we have decided to hold a creativity week next week when every afternoon, the curriculum will be collapsed and we will concentrate on the children's well-being.

Each year group and class have different activities organised but there will be a mixture of yoga activities, time for games, positivity and activities to help support their self-esteem. I am sure they will come home full of what they have been up to every day!

We play outside in all weathers so children should come with warm coats now that the weather is turning colder. If you are in doubt about sending extra layers, please do. It is lovely to be outside but there is nothing worse than feeling chilly!

Could we also ask that you spend a little time with your child encouraging them to put on and fasten their own coats and shoes? We are teaching them to be as independent as they can be, so your support with this is valued!
