


## Morning Snacks for KS2 Children

Our Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Nativity performances will be held in the Main School Hall on Wednesday 11th December at 10am and 2pm. The children in Leopards (Mr McLoughlin), Goldfish (Mrs Nash), Hedgehogs (Mrs Davis) and the Mon-Wed Robins (Mrs Moran) will take part in the morning performance. The children in Dolphins (Mr Osmond), Eagles (Miss Butler) and Wed-Fri and 30 hour Robins (Mrs Moran) will take part in the afternoon performance.

Children are welcome to dress up in Christmas themed clothes. These could be party clothes or they can come as characters from the Nativity. If your child is uncomfortable being dressed up, they can just come in normal non-uniform clothes. The Nativity performances in EYFS are planned as a relaxed, fun, singalong event, so please be prepared to join in! Please note, if you feel that your Nursery child needs to come home with you after their performance, please feel free to take them. The first time performing in a crowded hall can be a little overwhelming for some!

Our EYFS Christmas Party Day is planned for Wednesday 18th December. Again, the children in Leopards (Mr McLoughlin), Goldfish (Mrs Nash), Hedgehogs (Mrs Davis) and the Mon-Wed Robins (Mrs Moran) will take part in the morning party. ## Erasmus+ Visits



Next week is our first visit to one of our partner schools in our new project, 'Learning Outdoors, Learning for Life'. Mr McLoughlin, Mr Junemann and Mrs Davis are taking Alfie, Sam, Thomas and Aeden from Year 5 to spend the week in Bialystock in Poland. During our time there, we will spend some time in our partner school enjoying some outdoor education, visit the national forest as well as having time to explore the capital city of Warsaw. We will return with more ideas about how to develop our outdoor learning here.

During the first week in December, our partner schools in our other Erasmus+ project (Traditional Tales Across Europe) are coming to our school for our transnational meeting. Staff from Hungary and Germany will be meeting with our staff to discuss how to further develop our ideas and plans.

We will shortly be sending out letters to Year 5 about our visit to Denmark with four girls and Hungary with four boys in March 2020.

## Christmas Dinner



Christmas Dinner will be enjoyed by the children on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December. For this one special occasion, we do open this up to children who do not normally stay for school dinner. However, when potentially catering for over 400 people, we obviously do need to order food in advance. Therefore, if your child does not usually stay for a school dinner but would like to stay for their Christmas Dinner, it is essential that you let the Office know and pay £2.05 (this charge only applies to pupils from Year 3-6).

A separate form will go out next week and must be returned to school no later than **Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December**. We have disappointed children every year whose parents come to the Office too late to order their dinner. Some parents do not seem to realise that it is essential to have a cut-off point to be fair to everyone in school and think that one extra won't matter. However, if we do this for one family, we would have to do it for all and obviously this is just not possible. Therefore if your child does not normally stay for school dinner and you would like them to have Christmas Dinner, please adhere to the deadline of letting us know no later than Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December. ## New Dinner Menus



New menus have been sent home with your child today; I am sure many children are looking forward to a change of meal now the weather is becoming colder.

As you can appreciate, it is a mammoth task ensuring that each child has the correct choices inputted for their meals. Therefore, can you please ensure that the menu is returned no later than Tuesday 19th November. After this date, your child will be offered the deferred vegetarian menu. Thank you. We plan to start the new menu towards the end of this half term.

If your child would like to swap from packed lunch to school dinners or vice versa, please also let the office know immediately. We do ask for one week's notice for either move to ensure all the relevant systems are updated and any food ordering is correct.

Remember that meals are universally free for Reception to Year 2. Nursery and Years 3-6 pay £10.25 per week. If your child has a recognised allergy where we have an alternative menu please inform our Business Manager, Mrs Janette Marklew.



## Payments to School Office



I would like to remind you once again that we ask for at least one week's dinner money to be paid in advance on ParentPay to stop any arrears building up. This is the same for our wrap around care clubs. We really do pride ourselves on being able to offer such flexible wrap around care facilities but we must ask that these are paid for in advance in order for them to continue so successfully. Once again, please check your ParentPay accounts to keep on top of your child's payments. Thank you for your support with this.



## Residential Visits



### Ford Castle

Please remember to stick to the payment schedule for the trip. The next deposit is due by 2nd December 2019. Thank you.

With such a large party, it is imperative that we pay our invoices on time and we can only do that if all the scheduled deposits are received. I am afraid you do jeopardise your child's place on the trip if payments are missed/late. You can pay as often as you wish on ParentPay, as long as at least the expected amount is paid by each deadline date. Thank you for your help with this.

## After School Club Booking



If you would like your child to attend our wrap around care After School Club you MUST book them in. This can be done either through the online booking system on [www.ParentPay.com](http://www.ParentPay.com), by ringing the school office or emailing [school.office@lanchesterep.net](mailto:school.office@lanchesterep.net). Bookings can be made up until the afternoon of the club. This is essential, as teachers use the booking system to check who is supposed to be attending after school club.

If you are paying for wrap around care via childcare vouchers and are unable to use the online booking system, you can still book your child in by emailing the school office. If you have not booked your child into after school club, you will be contacted if your child has not been collected from school on time. This is a safeguarding issue so please help us to keep your child safe.

## Booking Issues

If you are unable to book sessions for wrap around care via ParentPay, please check if you have an outstanding balance. If you do, you cannot book further sessions until the balance is paid.

To do this please log into your account>bookings>unpaid bookings>pay any outstanding amount. Once any outstanding amounts are paid, you will be able to book further sessions.

## Cancelling Wrap-Around Care

If your child has been booked onto a wrap-around care session and does not attend or has been marked in by mistake, you MUST contact the school office who can reverse the charge. However, this can only be done for sessions within the half term that the charge comes from. No refunds will be made for clubs not attended in previous half terms.

Please do not forget that the only after school club running in the last week of term will be the usual wrap around care. Please remember that no other clubs will be running in the last week of term. Thank you.

Our Christmas Fair takes place between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> December. As usual, there will be a huge variety of stalls including a raffle, tombola stalls, Christmas gifts, craft activities and stalls for children, refreshments and a number of gift stalls. In addition to these, the children's enterprise goods which they make during the week will also be on sale. For this event, children can be collected early from the classrooms so that they can accompany you to the fair. This is usually a lovely, social afternoon and one which we all look forward to. Tickets go on sale on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December.

Additional Tickets go on sale on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> December.

Years 3 – 6 Nativity & Christingle which takes place on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> December at 10am and 2pm.

Tickets are not required but a retiring collection for the Homeless will be taken.

All tickets will be available from the school office. If you are unable to make it into the school office, please put your money in an envelope with your child's name on and the number of tickets you would like for each performance. This can either be sent in with your child, or you can put it in the post box in the entrance area if the school office is closed.



## Christmas Parties



The Christmas parties are listed on the diary dates at the end of the newsletter. We suggest that on their party day, children can either come to school for the day in their party clothes, or they can bring their clothes to change into at lunchtime when staff will be available to help. All parties finish at the end of the school day.

This year again, each party is having slightly different arrangements for their party food. Foundation Stage children will all be given their own party bag in advance to take home and fill with food that they would like to eat and these are then to be brought into school on the day of their party. This way, at this early age, we know that all children will be eating something that they like! ***Please note – nuts are NOT allowed in school due to us having a number of children with a nut allergy. ## !Dogs and Cars!



Our school population is ever-increasing and with it, so are some issues! We need your help please. Firstly, parking – please do not use the staff car park for any drop offs or pick ups – it is just not big enough. This applies to parents collecting children from After School Club as well. It is essential that you park on the road outside in order to keep all our children safe.

Dogs are not allowed on school grounds –thank you for this. However, it has come to our attention that there are some dogs being tied up right outside the school gates where 400+ children, along with their adults are walking. There are many of our children who have a real fear of dogs – please bear this in mind when deciding on an appropriate location for your dog.

We really are not trying to be awkward with either of these issues – just practical! Thank you for your support.
