#### Dear Parents/Carers,

For me personally, this has been a very long two weeks. After testing positive for Covid a week past Tuesday, I have been stuck at home trying to work, but also fighting this virus which has really taken its toll on me. We continue to have some positive cases across school in both children and staff, but thankfully, they do seem to have slowed down slightly this week. We have had staff out on phonics training again this week and myself and four more staff are in Birmingham next week for our final training too. It has been very intensive – every member of staff having had 4 whole days - but we do hope that it is going to make a difference to our children.

#### **Head Lice**

It is a while since we have had any outbreaks of head lice in school, but it appears that they are also back to normal and out of isolation as well as us! We have had a report of head lice in school but please remember that the key to keeping on top of this is regular checking of your child's hair with the special nit comb that can be purchased very reasonably from any chemists. The School Nurse recommends checking your child's hair at least once a week.

The School Nurse also recommends that we do not report to parents when we have an outbreak in school as checking your child's hair should be done at least weekly regardless of whether we have an outbreak in school or not.

#### **Parking**

As you will be aware from an email earlier in the week, this continues to be an issue. However, I do think this needs to be a complete change in mind set for us rather than reacting when the police do make an appearance.

I have been in touch with the new owner of the Kings Head. He is more than happy for parents to continue to use the car park which is great news. I know parents who park there and say it is so stress free! No rushing around trying to find a space, no irate parents around and then a lovely 5 minute walk with their child too. Please consider this as a serious option.

In addition, one parent has suggested that we have a group of volunteer parents who act as parking marshals at key times. This is something I will have to look into with the police, but if you would be interested in helping with this, please email the school office and we will be in touch.

You may have seen the news recently where a child has been seriously hurt after being hit by a vehicle outside school. I do not want this to be any of our children and we all need to work together to make sure it isn't!

#### **Dogs on School Site**

We still have a number of children who do not have wellies in school. Please supply a named pair for them to keep in school. Alternatively, choose some from the Nursery fence for them to use and let a member of staff know so they can be stored where your child can easily access them.
