Year 6 will continue to be split into three classes for the morning sessions and will come back together again as two classes for most afternoons. Whilst they will have new 'registration' teachers, the children will be set every morning for Maths and English. So whilst your child may be transferring to one registration teacher as stated here, they may not actually be taught by that teacher. At the end of this academic year, the staff will be meeting to discuss which group every child should be taught in in the morning sessions.

Mrs Coyle and Mrs Sant will share responsibility for their class with Mrs Coyle teaching Maths and English every morning and Mrs Sant teaching the foundation subjects every afternoon.

Mrs Knighton, Mr Graham, Mr Bailey and Mrs Hamill will continue to teach Music, P.E., Computing and French across the school. Mr McLoughlin and Mrs Riddell will be teaching across the school to give release time to members of the Senior Leadership Team and to cover staff PPA (Planning, Preparation and Assessment) time.

Timing of the School Day for September 2022

Some of you may be aware of new legislation which has stated that the length of the school day must be at least 32.5 hours per week. However, the 15 minutes which we use for the flexible drop off cannot be included in this timing as this is not compulsory teaching time.

We did not want to lose this flexible drop off time as we believe it does ease some of the traffic issues in the village. Therefore, we have to adjust the timing of our school day slightly from September. Therefore the school day will be:

> 8.30-8.45am Flexible Drop Off 8.45am **School Day Begins** 3.15pm **School Day Finishes**

Nursery timinings will stay the same as this year, which are:

8.45 - 11.45am **Morning Sessions** 12.15 – 3.15pm **Afternoon Sessions** 9.00am - 3.00pm Full Day Sessions

Art Exhibition

All children from Nursery to Year 6 are going to be busy creating artwork over the next few weeks. Some of the designs will then be chosen to go on the cover of the programme for our production of 'One Sun, One World' at Consett Empire Theatre. The theme for the artwork is nature, animals, the world and how we can care for it.

A company called 'Images- School Art Exhibitions' are then going to frame all of the creations so that the children will have their work displayed in a gallery, something to be extremely proud of! We plan on having this on display on the afternoon of Friday 15th July in the school hall as well as at the Summer Fair the day after. You will be able to buy your child's framed artwork as well - they will be £8.00 each, there will be discounts for those of you with multiple children. There will only be one copy of each original artwork, which will be signed by the artist!

Nursery Big Toddle

Nursery's Big Toddle in aid of Barnardo's Children's Society will be taking place on Wednesday 6th July. The children are asked to come into school dressed in sports clothes or as an animal, as there is a jungle theme. Sponsor forms will be handed out soon to our Nursery children. From Monday 11th to Friday 15th July, we will be having "Farewell Tea Parties" in the wild for our Nursery leavers, where parents are welcome to come along and play with their children, meet their new Reception class teacher and Miss Dawson will be coming over from All Saints to meet her new starters too. Groups and dates will be organised in the next couple of weeks.

Price Increases



We are all well aware of how the increased cost of living, energy and fuel price hikes are impacting our daily lives. It seems that costs for certain things are going up daily and unfortunately our school is not immune to that - we too have been affected by the sharp rise in costs to run the school. Our energy costs have risen by the cost of a member of teaching staff this year...

Unfortunately, this means that we have no alternative to increase some charges slightly from September.

Wrap Around Care Charges

Breakfast - £4.00 per session -this will remain free of charge for those children eligible for Free School Meals. Afterschool club - £5.00 until 4:15pm. Afterschool club - £7.00 until 5:15pm (5:00pm on Friday)

School Meal Charges

We have also been advised by the local authority that the cost of dinners will also increase to £2.25 per day from September which meals dinners will cost £11.25 per week.

If you have any trouble paying any outstanding amounts to school, please do not hesitate to contact us - we are here to help and would rather have that conversation with you instead of any arrears getting out of control. Office News



Year 6 Parents and Carers/Those Leaving Nursery

Please check your ParentPay accounts and ensure that any outstanding amounts are cleared no later than **July 8**th **2022**. If you have any credit on the accounts, you can request a transfer to a sibling account or a refund to your Parent Pay account. Nut Free School

This is a polite reminder that we are a nut free school. We have a number of children in school with nut allergies, some of which are severe. We therefore ask that you adhere to this policy and do not send your child into school with any products containing nuts. Thank you.

Small Electric Recycling

We are taking part in a Durham County Council competition to encourage recycling of small electrical items. If you have any unwanted items such as freeview boxes, cd players & radios, remote controls, kettles, electronic toys, hairdryers & straighteners, kettles, irons, toaster, scales, tablets & phones etc. then please bring them into the school office - we need to fill the box before 1st July to be in with a chance of winning this competition. School Menu

We have been informed by the Local Authority that there will be a new menu sent out in the next few weeks to start in September. As soon as this comes out this will need to be completed and sent back into school so that we know what we need to order for the first week back. Please remember if you decide that your child wants to change from school meals to packed lunch or vice-versa, you MUST email the School Office and give at least two weeks' notice.

School Meals - Year 2 moving into Year 3

Do not forget that if your child is in Year 3 from September and you are not entitled to Pupil Premium then you will be charged for school meals in September at £2.25 per day. If you would like to change your child onto packed lunch from September, please make sure you email the School Office, otherwise you will be charged. Thank you.

One Sun, One World

All children from Years 3 – 6 will be taking part in our musical extravaganza at the end of the summer term in Consett Empire Theatre. The whole school has a real buzz about this show with work taking place in every corner of the school – artwork, costume & scenery making, singing & line learning happening all over the place - the excitement and pride of the children is palpable!

On Wednesday 13th July and Thursday 14th July the performances will take place at 6pm. All children are involved in both performances and need to be brought to the theatre for 5.30pm on those evenings. On Wednesday 13th July, we have the theatre booked for the whole day for rehearsals. All children will need a packed lunch as we will be leaving school for the Empire Theatre at 9.15am in the morning for our dress rehearsal and will stay there for lunch and the afternoon. Children will then return to school to be collected as normal but will need to return to the Empire Theatre for 5.30pm in time for the evening performance.

Ticket Sales

We will be selling tickets for the musical from the School Office from Monday 27th June. Tickets will be £5 per person. We have kept the cost as low as possible but obviously need to try to cover our costs – hire of the theatre, royalty costs, scenery, costumes etc. In order to purchase tickets, you will need to fill in an envelope with the following details:

- Child's Full Name
- Number of tickets required for each performance (this is limited to 4 per family prior to 4th July)

The envelope then needs to contain the correct amount of money for the number of tickets requested or a cheque made out to 'Lanchester EP Primary School Fund'. Unfortunately, we will not be able to sell these via ParentPay. Please note, the office will not be able to give change so you must include the correct money for the tickets. Tickets will not be given out or reserved if payment is not made. Tickets that have been bought will then go home with your child. We aim to do this 48 hours after we have received payment.

Initially, tickets will be limited to 4 per family over the two evenings. This is simply to ensure that ALL families have the opportunity to buy tickets. However, after Monday 4th July, all tickets for both nights will go on open sale for families to buy as many tickets as they would like.

Any parents of other year groups are also welcome to purchase tickets to come and see the show as well.

Each year group are taking different parts – some are trees, others are rats, animals, children of the world, some are thunder and lightning and we have some wonderfully talented soloists who are taking on the roles of Tigers, Polar Bears, Pandas and Cacao. The children, as usual, are showing amazing talent and skill and we know this is going to be another wonderful and memorable event for them all.

Costumes for One Sun, One World

We have an army of staff working hard on the costumes but need parents and carers to provide some items for the show. We ask that these can be brought into school in a named carrier bag from Monday 27th June. Please make sure the clothes are also labelled.

End of Year Reports and Results



The staff are all very busy writing the children's end of year reports which we aim to hand out on Friday 15th July 2022. At that time, all the statutory test results will be shared. These include:

- Reception parents will be informed about their end of year assessments
- Year 1 parents will find out the results of the phonics screening check
- Year 2 parents will be given the end of key stage teaching assessments
- Year 4 parents will find out about the results of the Multiplication Check
- Year 6 parents will receive the results of the SATs tests.

While we do receive the test results earlier than that for Year 6, these are never shared with children or parents until the reports are given out and until we have had chance to go through the test papers to check for any errors. I am sure you will appreciate that this is quite a time-consuming task!

SPORTS NEWS

What an amazing summer of sport we have had so far! We ended last half-term with another hugely successful Fun and Fitness week; the children had a very enjoyable four days taking part in the Sports Carousel (cricket, Skip2bfit, the inflatable obstacle course and street games), House Games, Wheels Day and Sports Day. The children displayed wonderful teamwork and sportsmanship throughout the house competition (dodgeball in KS1 and rounders in KS2) and the eventual winners were the Normans - well done Normans! Likewise, the children were fantastic throughout both the KS1 and KS2 Sports Days; this time it was the Danes that were winners - congratulations Danes!

There have been four inter-school sports competitions in recent weeks. First, the Year 5/6 girls football team performed remarkably and won all their games until losing in the final on penalties. The Year 5 boys five-a-side football team played brilliantly, narrowly missing out on progressing to the finals. Our Year 6 girls cricket team finished a very impressive second. Most recently, our Year 5/6 netball team played unbelievably well, winning five games out of six. Next up, we have the Year 3/4 cricket competition.

Well done to everyone involved - the sporting future of Lanchester EP is certainly looking bright.

Our very popular summer fair is being held on the final Saturday of term on Saturday 16th


