Sports News

After nearly two years without a game, the girls football team have made a fantastic start to the new season with victories in their opening two matches. The team, none of whom had

Healthy Snacks

Whilst children in Early Years and KS1 do receive a free piece of fruit every day, there are occasions when they do not like what is provided and are feeling quite hungry in a morning. So, if you would like to provide your child with a healthy snack or piece of fruit in a morning, that is absolutely fine! Please do not put it in your child's packed lunch box though – keep it separate so we know it is for the morning snack rather than at lunchtime. Please also remember that we are nut free school. Thank you.

Reading Books Sale

As many of you will have realised, we have changed our approach to reading and are now using a very popular and successful scheme called Accelerated Reader. All books

which are in this scheme have now been logged and are in our library for children to access. However, there are a number of books which do not form part of this scheme and we have lots of 'spare' books in school which we will no longer be using.

We plan to hold a Reading Book Sale on Friday 24th September in school where each class will be able to go down and buy any book they would like. These will be sold at 20p per book or children can buy a maximum of 5 books for £1. I am sure the children will thoroughly enjoy looking at all the books and trying to decide which one they want to keep!

Accelerated Reader Workshop

We are always very grateful for the wonderful support we receive from parents with your children's reading and as we have started a new reading scheme this year, we thought it would be useful to hold a workshop so that we can explain about it all in more detail.

On Thursday 30th September we will be holding Accelerated Workshops in school at 8.45am and 2.30pm in the Junior Hall. At these sessions, we will be explaining how the scheme works, how your children are assessed and how appropriate books are chosen. We look forward to seeing you there.

Reception 2022 Admissions

For children born between **1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018**, you need to complete an application, stating which primary school you would like your child to attend.

You still need to apply even if you have an older child attending the same school, and **even if you attend Nursery at Lanchester EP you must still apply for a Reception place**. Each year we have a number of children who miss out on a place in our Reception because parents have forgotten to apply for a place. **The deadline for applications is midnight on Friday, 15 January 2022.** The offer of school places will be made on 19th April 2022.

Applying for a Secondary School place 2022

For children born between **1 September 2010 and 31 August 2011**, you need to complete an application, stating which secondary school you would like your child to attend. The application process opened on September 14th and you will have received a letter regarding this (sent to Year 6 parents via eSchools and also available on the school website).

The deadline for secondary school applications is midnight on Sunday 31 October 2021. Once again, it is very important to apply for a secondary school place by the deadline, as a late application greatly reduces your chances of getting a place at your preferred school.

If you are unable to apply online, please download the form from the website address above. Please note, we have been advised by Durham County Council that we cannot send in forms on behalf of parents.

Phonics

All Reception and Key Stage 1 staff have been out of school for 4 days training recently as we have started a new approach to teaching phonics in school. Over time, every single member of staff in school will be trained in this new method and it is hoped that it will have a big impact on phonics and spelling across school.

Again, we know many parents and carers like to support their children as much as possible with their phonics so are holding a parent workshop on Thursday 14th October at 8.45am and 2.30pm for any interested parents. These will both take place in the Junior Hall.



Erasmus+ Projects



We have been very fortunate to have been awarded hundreds of thousands of pounds of funding over the last 10 years to develop partnerships with many different European schools. This funding, from the British Council, has now come to an end due to Brexit.

However, we were successful in the last round of funding with two more projects being agreed. This means that for the current academic year, we have three Erasmus+ projects which we are working on with a grand total of 12 different European countries. These were all put on hold for the last academic year but visits are starting again this year, with staff attending the meetings initially, and children visiting later in the year.

'Learning Outdoors, Learning for Life' is in its final year and we are working with partner schools in Poland, Sweden, Denmark and Spain. Myself, Mr Innes, Mr Keeton and Mrs Moran will be visiting this school at the beginning of October when we will be seeing how Polish schools take learning outdoors, meeting with key staff from all the schools and prioritising work and activities for the rest of this academic year.

We also have a new project entitled 'Happy Life, Happy Lifestyle' starting this year with partner schools in Germany, Hungary and Spain. A visit to Germany will take place in November when staff will meet the new partners and discuss how each of our schools supports emotional well-being and healthy living.

The final project is entitled 'European Tunes Choir for Peer Bullying' and we have partnered with schools in Turkey, Italy, Portugal, Greece and Latvia. The first visit will be to Portugal just before half term and I think the first barrier to overcome will be that of language! Luckily for us, most partners do know some English which certainly helps us!

As the year progresses, more visits will be organised which will also include taking some of our older children as well. We also hope to be able to welcome some of our partners into our school later this academic year too. Exciting times!

Visit to Rajkot, India

We were thrilled to find out at the start of the summer holidays that our application to the Turing Scheme had been successful and we have been awarded over £36,000 to take a group of children to our partner school in Rajkot in India. This is, indeed, a trip of a lifetime for children and adults alike! We are working closely with the International Office for the Local Authority and also a wonderful, independent consultant, Veena Soni to organise this incredible opportunity.

We have a meeting for all Year 5 & 6 parents over Zoom at 6.30pm on Wednesday 29th September when we will be sharing more information about the planned visit in February; the travel, organisation, visits, safeguarding, visas and vaccines. (***Please note the change of date and time for this meeting***)

I have also met with a couple of other teachers who took their students out to Rajkot, just prior to lockdown in February 2020. It was fascinating to hear of their adventures and their experiences, as well as see a selection of photos and videos. I will be sharing some of these at the meeting with parents.

Obviously, travel is still just starting to get back to some kind of normal and I realise that parents and carers may have many questions. I also realise that a trip like this is not for some families at all. I hope that a meeting when we can share a draft itinerary and plans would be useful for you all to be able to make an educated decision about whether you would like to put your child's name forward for this visit or not. Please note the change of date & time – this will now take place on Wednesday 29th September at 6.30pm

Following the meeting, we will put out a form for parents and carers who would like to put their child's name forward for such a trip. We have funding to take 16 children. If we have more than 16 parents expressing an interest in the trip for their child, then names will be pulled out of a hat. The staff have already had to do that and I am delighted to say that Mr Innes, Mr McLoughlin, Mr Keeton, Miss Butler, Mrs Moran and myself will all be accompanying the children on a trip of a lifetime!

School Uniform

It is lovely to see the children looking so smart in their school uniforms. Thank you for adhering to our policy of black footwear and sensible hairstyles with no shaved hair or tramlines. We would also like to thank you for providing your children with the correct P.E. uniform – this too makes a huge difference! I would just like to remind parents of Year 5 & 6 children though that when they come to school in their PE uniform, they do still need to wear their normal school sweatshirt rather than a sports hoodie. Thank you.

Parking Issues



We all know how chaotic it is outside school at the start and end of the school day and I am sure we all empathise with the local residents who have to put up with a huge influx of cars at those times. It is really important that we respect the local residents in how and where we park.

However, this week, I have received no fewer than 7 emails of complaint from both parents and residents about irresponsible and dangerous parking. There appear to be some people who think it is acceptable to:

- park both on the bend outside school and on double yellow lines
- park on the footpath
- park on the grass verges
- mount the footpaths
- reverse onto footpaths
- double park
- be abusive to local residents when asked to move their car

If this kind of parking continues, there is going to be a really nasty accident and one of our children will end up being seriously hurt. I know that none of us wants that to happen.

Please use all the parking facilities we have available to us in the village:

- Social Club Car Park (free)
- Community Centre Car Park (£25 per annum charge)
- Kings Head Car Park (free)

There is sufficient car parking in the village as long as we are prepared to walk for a maximum of 6 minutes.

Labelling of Clothing

Please can you remember to label anything and everything that a child can remove from their bodies! We already have had a number of jumpers, cardigans, shoes, shorts etc left lying around school which we have tried to reunite with their owners. It really would be appreciated if you can remember to name all items of clothings and belongings. Thank you!

School Dinners



If you require to change a meal selection, then please note that we can only accept changes for future weeks. For example, if you know in Week 1 that your child does not like their choice, please look ahead at the choices made for any other week and day that a similar meal has been selected and advise the office accordingly. The future weeks can be adjusted but no changes can be made for the current dinner week, i.e. if we are in Week 1 and they want to swap a meal, this change will not be seen on their menu until Week 1 comes around again. Again, this is to ensure that the correct food is ordered in good time. Thank you.

Parents' Evenings

Our termly parents' evenings will be held during the last week of the half term and for our Nursery parents, we will be spreading these evenings out over the last two weeks of the half term. We hope to meet with parents in person and give you the opportunity to see your child's work but this will have to be confirmed nearer the time as it is dependent upon what happens in the next few weeks with Covid.

eSchools app

Our eSchools app is a great way of keeping up to date with what is going on in school. As soon as newsletters are published they are sent straight to the app. This enables you to know straight away our latest news and events. eSchools also contains some important information on the class pages about what your child will be learning.

We also offer parents evening appointments via this app. You will be able to see clearly what dates and times are available that suit you. When your child starts school at Lanchester E.P., all parents are issued with a username and password for eSchools which is all you need to get started. New Nursery parents should get their log in details today.

If at any point, you forget your username or password, please get in touch with the school office who can reissue the details. If you have any further questions, please just contact the school office.

Twitter

Our number of Twitter followers continues to grow rapidly (1,782) and our pupils receive some amazing learning experiences via this platform. In the past few years we have interacted with authors, athletes and even an astronaut! The response from parents to our school Twitter account has also been very positive and we urge you to follow us: @lanchesterep.

By positively using social media in school, pupils are learning how to post correctly and how not to share personal information online. With this in mind can we please request that you **DO NOT NAME CHILDREN** when making comments on our school Twitter account. No individual child should be identifiable from images posted online and so it is important that names are not associated with these images. We love receiving your comments and photographs online, but request that you use generic terms such as my child, my son, my daughter etc. when commenting about specific children.

I do think that our twitter feed has really helped to keep our community together during a really tough 18 months when we have been forced to be physically apart. I must admit, that whilst I have been at home isolating this week, it has kept me informed about what has been going on at school in my absence too! It also brings a smile to my face every time I see those wonderfully happy and enthusiastic little faces! I just hope it has the same effect on you all!

Water Bottles

Please remember to send your child with their school water bottle every day. We do continue to send the water bottles home to be cleaned and filled every day. But it is essential that these are brought back to school daily. If your child has lost or broken their water bottle, replacements can be purchased at a cost of £2 from school. However, if your child just forgets their water bottle, please do not worry — we always have cups we can give the children.

Blended Learning

Blended Learning is another new phrase which has now become part of our everyday vocabulary! As a school, we have to prepare for the possibility of children needing to self-isolate for up to 10 days if testing positive for Covid-19. In addition to this, we expect to have a number of children needing to isolate until they receive a test and their test results.

So, to try to ensure your child's education is as fluid and consistent as possible, this is our pledge to you:

- For children isolating when waiting for a test. There are a number of activities and websites on your child's home page on eSchools or Evidence Me for Early Years children. These can be completed during the first day of absence. Following this, please email the school office or your child's class teacher and they will email you with the work missed in school.
- For children needing to self-isolate for 10 days. Work will be uploaded to your child's eSchools page as it was during lockdown. If your child is too poorly to complete their work, just let us know.
- If your child has to isolate but does not have access to technology during the day, please let us know.
 We do have some chrome books we can loan out and we can also provide work packs and books if you prefer.
- If your child is absent from school as they are poorly and not well enough to attend school, then they are not well enough to complete work at home and work will not be set for them.

If you have any questions at all about any of this, please do not hesitate to ask!



COVID-19 Information



Advice to All Parents and Carers

We have a number of confirmed cases of COVID-19 within the school. NHS test and trace have been in contact with individuals who have been identified as a close contact to let them know if they are legally required to self-isolate, and to provide further advice.

How to stop coronavirus (COVID-19) spreading:

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with coronavirus (COVID-19):

- get vaccinated everyone aged 16 and over can book COVID-19 vaccination appointments now
- wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
- meet people outside and avoid crowded areas
- open doors and windows to let in fresh air if meeting people inside
- wear a face covering when it's hard to stay away from other people particularly indoors or in crowded places
- participate in twice weekly LFD testing following national guidelines (recommended for 11 years and over). We encourage you to log your results here: https://www.gov.uk/log-test-site-covid19-results

Isolation

From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid. Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school until they get the test result, as long as they have no symptoms.

Communication with School

It continues to be important that if your child has to go for a PCR test, please inform the school office of this: school.office@lanchesterep.net and it is also essential that you let us know the result when you have this too. Although schools are no longer required to 'Track and Trace' we are still expected to have this information and may be contacted by Public Health to assist them. Thank you.

Questionnaire Results

At the end of every academic year, we send out a questionnaire for parents and carers so that we know what you think we are doing well and which areas you think we could improve upon.

Thank you all for your additional comments from the questionnaires. We had so many very positive comments which were so appreciated by all staff. However, we also really appreciated your suggestions as well and these have and continue to be considered. We have taken on board your requests about more notice for residentials – these are highlighted on the diary dates. We will also be sending out more regular progress reports this year too. We have summarised some of the questionniare comments received as it is just impossible to share them all. However these are the key points raised:

What are we doing well?

- Everything! Putting the emotional wellbeing of the children above all else. Help and support offered
 during home learning. Quickly adapted to home learning situation. Staff know all children throughout
 the school. Amazing range of activities offered. Staff are approachable and supportive. Mrs Davis
 works tirelessly and with such dedication to ensure the best possible school experience for all children.
- Caring, responsive, approachable, down to earth
- I think the leadership and management of the school and the staff working remotely has been exceptional in this unprecedented past academic year!
- Making every child feel valued and part of the school and wider community. Children are seen as individuals and their strengths valued and encouraged.
- Kindness, inclusiveness, strong management and leadership, provides a loving, caring environment
- Everything. As a former lead inspector I think the school has a caring ethos which shines through all its work and is underpinned by the committed and inspirational leadership of the headteacher
- Excellent pastoral care from devoted, hard- working staff who go above and beyond to support children and their families. Wonderful extra-curricular opportunities e.g. visits, residentials, clubs etc.
- It feels like the children have joined a huge family. Everyone is caring and your child is treated like an individual whose safety and well-being is crucial to the wellbeing of the whole school. The leadership is inspiring and motivating and makes us feel our child would not be safer or happier anywhere else.

- Leadership, communication, child centred ethos, wellbeing, parental inclusion, responsiveness, fun, activities, well rounded holistic approach, transparency and openness.

- The school has a strong sense of community and brings the whole village together. The extra curricula, trips and additional provision available for the children is exemplary. I really value that the school focuses on the wider development of the child, as I believe this shapes them to be better off in life, giving them confidence and appropriate life skill.
- Although Lanchester EP gives children a strong academic foundation, I believe its real strength is in
 producing well rounded individuals with a strong sense of self-worth, with respect and compassion
 towards others, and a positive attitude to life and work that will stand them in good stead for the rest
 of their lives.
- All the staff make go above and beyond to make school and fun and welcoming place to be. This year they have provided vital stability and reassurance despite the challenges.
- There is an excellent community spirit in the school. It really feels like the teachers care about my

What do you think our school could do better?

- No written or online homework except for spellings and times tables at KS1. I feel that it's often given just to tick a box and it's always painful to do in our house! Reading, spellings and times tables are much more useful in my opinion.
- Wider range of subjects and topics within the academic curriculum, but appreciate that this may be limited by what statutory requirements as to what should be taught through the curriculum e.g. more history and culture from around the world
- Give parents more notice of trips and trip costs aware this hasn't been possible this year but in future it would be great to know earlier so it is easier for families to plan their expenses.
- Progress reports throughout the year
- Just more homework
- Consider wider access to information on twitter for those who do not have this
- No homework don't agree with children needing to work at home
- During lockdown and remote learning it would be better if the children had a full learning day online with their teachers as they would as if in school
- Open 52 weeks a year :)
- Additional support for those with low academic confidence

Any Other Comments?
