Social Distancing



I think our vocabulary has certainly increased this year as I do not think I had heard of the term 'social distancing' a year ago and I never dreamt I would be writing about the need for social distancing in a newsletter!

As you are all no doubt very aware, the footpaths around our school at key drop-off and pick-up times are rather congested. Even though we have five different staggered start times and are using five different entrances and exits, with 430 children, it does get very busy.

I am having discussions with the local authority to possibly introduce a one-way system on the footpaths so that parents coming from the village would walk on the footpath adjacent to the school and when returning back towards the village, you cross the road and walk on the footpath next to the bungalows. I do think this will make social distancing a little easier.

Also, I would also like to suggest that parents and carers wear a face covering when collecting your children. Obviously this is all in an attempt to you keep you all as safe as possible. I cannot enforce this but I do realise how tricky it is to practise social distancing at these very busy times.

I also need to ask parents of Year 2 children not to allow your children to wander or play on the school grounds when collecting your children. Obviously, we have to keep the children in their separate bubbles all day and it is really important that you leave the grounds immediately after collecting your children.

Thank you so much to Year 1 parents – I think the new pick up times of 3.10pm for Mrs Burke's class and 3.20pm for Mr McLoughlin's class definitely help to ease the congestion so we will be keeping these new times for the foreseeable future.

Thank you all in anticipation – these are tricky times for us all and it is just so important that we continue to keep each other as safe as possible.

Reception 2021 Admissions



For children born between **1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017**, you need to complete an application, stating which primary school you would like your child to attend.

You still need to apply even if you have an older child attending the same school, and **even if you attend Nursery at Lanchester EP you must still apply for a Reception place**. Each year we have a number of children who miss out on a place in our Reception because parents have forgotten to apply for a place. **The deadline for applications is midnight on Friday, 15 January 2021.**

Applying for a Secondary School place 2021.



For children born between **1 September 2009 and 31 August 2010**, you need to complete an application, stating which secondary school you would like your child to attend. The application process opened on September 14th and you will have received a letter regarding this (sent to Year 6 parents via eSchools and also available on the school website).

The deadline for secondary school applications is midnight on Saturday 31 October 2020. Once again, it is very important to apply for a secondary school place by the deadline, as a late application greatly reduces your chances of getting a place at your preferred school.

Erasmus+ Projects



As you may know, our school has a long history of working with partner schools all across Europe, having had a Comenius or Erasmus+ project since September 2010. This has given our children the opportunity to visit many different countries and increase their awareness of a plethora of different countries and cultures.

We have one project called 'Learning Outdoors, Learning for Life' which started last year and we are working with partner schools in Poland, Sweden, Denmark and Spain. We had a wonderful visit to our school by all our partner schools last November and took some Year 5 children on a visit to Poland in November and Hungary in early March but sadly, our visit to Denmark last March had to be postponed to March 2021. The British Council have agreed to extend the length of this project by 12 months due to COVID-19.

During the summer, we also received the exciting news that we have been successful in our bids for two more projects. We have some longstanding partnerships with schools in Hungary and Germany and two other schools in Poland and Spain have also partnered up with us for a project entitled 'Happy Life, Happy Lifestyle'.

The final project is entitled 'European Tunes Choir for Peer Bullying' and we have partnered with schools in Turkey, Italy, Portugal, Greece and Latvia. This is rather ironic as of course we can neither travel nor sing at the moment so we will have to be patient before we start work on this project!

We were delighted to have two more projects confirmed because we do not know what will happen longer term with these Erasmus+ projects due to Brexit. We hope that we will be able to begin visiting these schools with children again in the spring term but we will keep you posted about this.

School Dinners

We always pride ourselves in providing a variety of hot meals but unfortunately due to the current circumstances we are unable to offer the range we usually do. Rest assured, we are doing our best to make sure that after half term, our normal service will resume!

Dinners FAQs.

My child would like to swap to or from school meals.

You can only swap from either Packed Lunch to School Meal or vice versa with 4 weeks notice. Please email: school.office@lanchesterep.net to advise us of the change. This is to ensure that all catering order timelines can be adhered to. We do thank you for your understanding with this.

If you require to change a meal selection.

We can only accept changes for future weeks. For example, if you know in Week 1 that your child does not like the ham sandwich, please look ahead at the choices made for any other week and day that ham has been selected and advise the office accordingly. The future weeks can be adjusted but no changes can be made for the current dinner week, i.e. if we are in Week 1 and they want to swap a meal, this change will not be seen on their menu until Week 1 comes around again. Again, this is to ensure that the correct food is ordered in good time. Thank you.



School Uniform



It is lovely to see the children looking so smart in their school uniforms. Thank you for adhering to our policy of black footwear and sensible hairstyles with no shaved hair or tramlines. We would also like to thank you for providing your children with the correct P.E. uniform – this too makes a huge difference! If your child is in Reception to Year 6, you will have received an emailed letter about the flu vaccine, which will be being carried out in our school on November 26th. The letter is also on our website. You will need the school code which is 131168. Consent must be given at least two days before the vaccines take place.

If you do not want your child to have the flu vaccine, you don't need to do anything - vaccines cannot be given to children without parental consent, via the link above.

When your child starts school at Lanchester E.P., all parents are issued with a username and password for eSchools which is all you need to get started. New Nursery parents should get their log in details today.

If at any point, you forget your username or password, please get in touch with the school office who can reissue the details. If you have any further questions, please just contact the school office.



Wrap Around Care



An online form will be sent out next week for you to book all wrap-around-care for the week beginning Monday 28th September. We feel that we can now offer this extra provision for parents who require it.

However, it will have to operate slightly differently this year with all places booked and paid for in advance. Any outstanding debts will also need to be cleared before we can allow your child to stay this year. We will need to be very careful with our numbers of children from each year group in order to keep bubbles separated.

Please note, that whilst Mr Graham will take children outside, when they are in the school building, they will all be required to sit in their set seat whilst in the hall.

I realise this will be very different from what they are used to, but obviously it is important that we adhere to all the government guidelines.



Twitter

No individual child should be identifiable from images posted online and so it is important that names are not associated with these images. We love receiving your comments and photographs online, but request that you use generic terms such as my child, my son, my daughter etc. when commenting about specific children.

Your response to twitter during the lockdown was just wonderful! There were so many tweets from you that we just could not possibly re-tweet everything that was being posted. We are so pleased you liked the twitter challenges too - thank you for engaging so brilliantly with it!

You may have noticed that the Daily Davis Updates have now become the Weekly Davis Updates! I will continue to just round off each week with some of my thoughts and reflections.



COVID-19 Information



It is really important that we all understand the symptoms of coronavirus. There are just 3 symptoms – a high temperature, a new or persistent cough and a loss or change of smell and taste. At this time of year there are obviously a lot of children developing a cold. A runny nose or sore throat are NOT symptoms, so children can come to school, as long as they feel well enough. If a child has sickness and diarrhoea, they must stay off school for 48 hours. Please look at the flow chart below which will help you make the decision about whether your child needs to stay away from school and have a test.

What do I do if my child is feeling unwell?

Would you have kept them off school before Covid-19?

Keep them off school.

If they are displaying any of the following:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to their taste or smell.

...you *MUST* get them tested before they can return to school.

Please follow the guidance below.

Children who are otherwise well with:

- a runny nose
- a sore throat without a temperature
- a mild cold

..... can go to school as normal

My child is displaying **one or more** of the following symptoms:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to their sense of taste or smell

These are the main symptoms of coronavirus(Covid-19).

You **MUST** get a test as soon as possible to check if you have the virus.

Select the track and testing option.

OR, visit www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test
to order a test to your home.

Call 119 if you do not have online access.

Your child and household **MUST** self-isolate for 14 days from the first day of symptoms.

You cannot leave the house for any reason apart from being tested.

You must self-isolate until the results come back.

If the results are negative you can resume normal activities.



Early Years News



We are pleased that our new starters are settling in well to the Nursery routine.

Within the next couple of weeks, we will put the children into groups with their Key Worker who will be the adult in Nursery who will be mainly responsible for supporting your child in their journey with us. We will let you know as soon as this is decided and will send a welcome message via Evidence Me, so please look out for that.

In the coming weeks, we will be introducing your child to Tales Toolkit. We use this in EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) and KS1 (Key Stage 1) to support the children to develop creativity, communication and language and literacy skills in an exciting, interactive way. We are very much hoping that you will carry on this learning at home and we hope to run some training for parents in the near future to explain how the system works. We will be sending home a link via Evidence Me, where you can find out more about Tales Toolkit.

We will also have phonics/reading video prepared for parents during the first week in October. Usually we would have a parental session in school but obviously this is not possible at the moment. So instead, we will post the video on the website and on Evidence Me and you will have the opportunity to ask any questions via email to us following the video. We hope you will find this useful.

We would also like to remind Nursery parents that the Nursery sessions are either 15 hours or 30 hours per week. If your child accesses more than their allotted hours, then you will be charged for wraparound sessions. If you are co-ordinating sibling drop-offs and pick-ups, please ensure that Nursery children are dropped off **after** older siblings and collected **before** them. In order to help us have the children ready for pick-up it is essential that we know what time the children will be collected from Nursery. Please liaise with Miss Butler to arrange these times. Thank you.



Blended Learning



Blended Learning is another new phrase which has now become part of our everyday vocabulary! As a school, we have to prepare for the possibility of a class, bubble or group of children needing to self-isolate for up to 14 days if we have a positive case of Covid-19. In addition to this, we expect to have a number of children needing to isolate until they receive a test and their test results.

So, to try to ensure your child's education is as fluid and consistent as possible, this is our pledge to you:

- For children isolating when waiting for a test. There are a number of activities and websites on your child's home page on eSchools. These can be completed during the first day of absence. Following this, please email the school office or your child's class teacher and they will email you with the work missed in school.
- For classes or bubbles needing to self-isolate for 10 – 14 days. It is essential that your child completes the set work at home. We will collect, mark and edit every piece of work and will challenge parents whose children have not completed their work.
- If your child's bubble or class is self-isolating, your child's class teacher will teach over Zoom at 9am, 11am and 1pm every day. At these times, the input will be given for Maths, English and Topic and they will then remain online to support if children if anyone needs to ask any further questions. At the end of each day, the teacher will make sure every child has participated in their learning.
- If your child does not have access to technology during the day, it is essential to let us know. A questionnaire will be emailed next week finding out this information. In this case, work packs and books will be available.
- If your child is poorly and not well enough to attend school, then they are not well enough to complete work at home and work will not be set for them.



Questionnaire Results



At the end of every academic year, we send out a questionnaire for parents and carers so that we know what you think we are doing well and which areas you think we could improve upon. The results of the questionnaire are below. This year we had 201 responses which was just wonderful – more than twice the number we have ever received in the past. Thank you so much for taking the time to respond.

They are, once again, overwhelmingly positive which is very pleasing for us as we do work exceptionally hard to ensure the children in our care are both well cared for and educated, as well as trying to ensure that relationships with parents and carers are positive. We care passionately about the children in our care, wanting the very best for them and working tirelessly to do our very best. What are we doing well?

- Providing a healthy happy safe place for children
- I think the last 8 years with EP have gone above and beyond my expectations for my child's education. You have undoubtedly provided support, motivation, dedication to name a few throughout the years!
- Making school a fun and safe place whilst enforcing good values and work ethic
- Puts the children's wellbeing first, has a great team of staff
- Communication is excellent
- The ethos of the school is fabulous, communication is brilliant and always well received. The care for the children and their families is great which has been shown even more so during these times. My children absolutely love the school and the teachers which is a testament to all that you do. Thank you Lanchester EP.
- It fosters a feeling of community, which makes me feel like my children really matter to you. I love that the mental health of the pupils and staff are taken seriously and thoughtfully considered.

What do you think our school could do better?

- It may have helped to have supplied some zoom interactive teaching classes as my child has struggled during this period and this would have helped
- It's a dream but smaller class sizes!
- Important news and updates used to come via text and now tend to come by twitter however the twitter feed is so popular and busy it's often easy to miss.
- Little bit more feedback on child's progress would be well received.
- I can't think of anything - you usually think of it anyway
- Re-think the space it has available to handle the drop off and pick up better
- Provide more notice when parental input is required
- There is a lot of pressure on parents, in the Early Years, to take part in 'stay and play sessions'. One or two per year would be more than sufficient (and doable) for working parents and grandparents
- Open a senior school so my child can stay until she is 18
- Explanation of what "expected progress" looks like and advise parents what we can do to support better progress in reports
- Push some of the children a little harder to help them achieve more

Any Other Comments?

- I want to commend the entire school for the response to lockdown. This was a challenging time for everyone, and I felt that the school dealt with it compassionately and appropriately. I particularly appreciated the headteacher's reminders to prioritise emotional well-being.
- The eSchools platform and twitter communication is absolutely brilliant. The learning that has been set up during the lockdown has been incredible and obviously very well thought out.
- We have really appreciated the encouragement phone calls and emails from the teachers and the motivational daily Davis tweets and encouraging words in the news letters.
- Just want to say huge amounts of respect for the way everything has been handled. You have all been awesome, thoughtful, respectful, helpful and most of all emphatic to everyone's feelings.
