Dear Parents/Carers,

This week has just been wonderful with Whole School Worship or Assemblies held every single day. We have waited two long years to be able to come together in person and it really has just been so very special. Children and adults alike have all just thrived on seeing each other in person – there really is nothing quite like it! We have also held a governor meeting in school and a meeting for parents too – what a fabulous week!

It is a year ago next week since the children finally returned to school after the final lockdown. Monday 8th March 2021 is a date which we will all remember. It has continued to be a long and tough year but I think we all believe we are finally through the worst and beginning to enjoy some great normality!

We have also celebrated different events this week too. Sunday 6th March 2022 – Y5&6 Residential to Dubai

We received a substantial amount of funding from the British Council through the Turing Scheme to take a group of children to learn more about the religion of a different country and to immerse themselves in the culture of that country. On Sunday, 16 children and 7 staff are flying to Dubai in the United Arab Emirates to spend the week there. During the week, time will be spent in Hartland International School (where children of 71 different nationalities attend), visiting the mosque, experiencing a traditional Emirati meal, visiting the old city and souks, going to Expo, going to the top of the Burj Kalifa whilst also spending some time on the beach and in the pool!

This really is a trip of a lifetime for those involved and we hope that their experience will have a lasting impact on both themselves and the school on their return.

Tickets will be on sale on ParentPay from 9am on Monday morning and are open to all our school community. OASES Working with Y4

On Monday, Miss Jackson's class worked with a member of OASES to complete their first 'Smart Homes' session. In this session, they discussed climate change and what is happening to our planet. They also completed an experiment to investigate melting ice caps. This coming Monday, they are going to complete the second and third sessions in this project where they will discuss ideas for what they can do at home in order to prevent climate change. The sessions will cover saving energy and sustainable houses.

Year 1 and Year 2 Wellingtons

You may have noticed some new wooden constructions in the Infant Yard. These are wellington holders for our Year 1 and Year 2 children. We are asking all children in these two year groups to bring a pair of wellingtons into school which can be left here so that they can change into them on a playtime and lunchtime so that they can play on the school field. Obviously, we have so much space on the field and it is a shame that in the past we have not been able to access it at all times due to the weather conditions. We are very keen to change this, and if children have wellingtons in school then they will be able to go onto the field whatever the weather, which gives them so much more space to play. Please make sure that your child's wellingtons are named and that they know what they look like to make it easier for them to find them. Thank you.

School Milk

As you will know, the school works with the Cool Milk Scheme to provide free school milk to children under the age of five, or for those who are entitled to free school meals (not the Reception - Y2 Universal Free School Meals). As soon as your child turns five, they will no longer be eligible to receive milk. However, you can pay to enable your child to be able to have milk in school - to do this, you need to visit the Cool Milk website <u>www.coolmilk.co.uk</u> and register your child. If your child is not registered once they are five then they will not be given milk, as this is only sent for children who are entitled to it.

If your child is over five and entitled to free school meals and would like to have milk in school, please email the school office and we will sign them up - however, please only do this if your child wants the milk, as this milk is paid for by the school. Thank you.

Early Years News

We have started using Class Dojo in Reception to promote positive behaviour. We are currently concentrating on being kind to others, being good listeners and being helpful when tidying up.
