Dear Parents and Carers,

It is a year ago this weekend since all schools closed to the majority of children and we entered into lockdown. It was at this time that words like pandemic, furlough, lockdown, social distancing began to drift into regular conversation. Our children have lived through a year of fear, isolation, bereavement and uncertainty and yet a year on, they appear (on the surface) relatively unscathed. Their resilience never ceases to amaze me but that is thanks to parents and carers who have kept them safe, sheltered from some fairly scary news and showered them with love and care.

I also think it is important to remember that our children have also lived through a year of immense positivity. The power of love has shone through so much this year and I think our children have learnt so much about kindness and care more than ever.

After two weeks back at school, it is clear that children thrive from being in school and being with each other. However, we are also re-teaching them respect, tolerance and patience as we are definitely dealing with an increased number of children falling out with each other as they learn how to socialise and just play and be with each other again!

We now seem to have a summer to look forward to and an element of normality beginning to creep back into our lives. I expect all the same systems to remain in place after the Easter break, but will communicate with you towards the end of the Easter holidays to confirm this. Please don't forget that we break up next Friday on 26<sup>th</sup> March for 2 weeks and return to school on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> April. Lots of local authorities have different Easter holidays this year so it is important to remember when ours are!

#### **Early Years News**

After the Easter holidays, we will be welcoming our Easter intake to Nursery. If you require additional wraparound hours, these must be paid for via ParentPay.

In the next few days, we will be sending out an online form for you to complete to confirm your drop-off time and your chosen collection time. This will also apply to children accessing a morning place who are dropped off early to fit in with siblings in school. It is important that you complete the form, even if you have already agreed your drop-off/pick-up times with Nursery staff, so that we have a complete list of times for our records. # LJG Coaching Holiday Club - Monday March 29th - Thursday April 1st.

As set out in the most recent government guidelines (COVID-19 Response – Spring 2021 guidance), LJG Coaching are allowed to offer:

- Outdoor provision to all children, without restrictions on the purpose for which they may attend
- Indoor provision to:
- o Vulnerable children and young people

o Other children, where provision is considered reasonably necessary to enable their parents/carers to: work, search for work, undertake education or training, attend a medical appointment or address a medical need, attend a support group

As far as possible, all activities will take place outdoors, with as little time spent inside as possible. However, it may be necessary for some activities to take place in the Junior Hall in case of bad weather.
