Dear Parents/Carers,

This week has been one of positivity, enthusiasm and enjoyment. We know that many Nursery parents are starting to think about which primary school to apply to for their child for September 2022. To help them make this crucial decision, we will be holding an Open Morning on Saturday 13th November between 10am and 12 noon. Please come along, meet some of the key staff, have a look at the environment in Reception and Key Stage One and ask as many questions as you would like!

However, if you would like to come and have a look round during the school day, we are also more than happy to show you round. Just email the school office and we will get back to you with some suggested dates. Choosing the right school for your child is probably one of the biggest decisions you will make for your child, therefore it has to be the right one!

School Office Information

Contact Details

Please make sure your contact details are up to date with the school office, if you have moved house or have a new mobile phone. It is really important that we are able to contact someone and there is nothing worse than not being able to get in touch with someone if their child is unwell.

ParentPay

Please make sure you keep your ParentPay account up to date and that you regularly check your balances, and keep your account in credit. If you have queries about your account, please contact the School Office.

Pupil Absences

Please make sure that you contact the school office if your child is not going to be in school with the reason for absence. This needs to be done before 9.15am, so that our registers are up to date.

Pupil Premium

If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, the school will receive extra funding called 'Pupil Premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school. We also use this funding to subsidise music tuition, provide milk and to greatly subsidise residential visits for eligible children.

Pupil Premium is provided for pupils who:

- Are registered for free school meals
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 years
- Are, or have been, in care
- Have parents in the armed forces

Eligibility Criteria

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 & 2

Whilst pupils in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 already get free school meals, it is still important to apply for pupil premium if you fit the criteria above.

How to Register

If you think you are eligible, please contact the school office, who will give you a form to fill in and will then run a check with the local authority. If your child is already entitled to free school meals and pupil premium, you do not need to register again. However, if you were not eligible and your circumstances have changed, please do contact the school office to run another check.

Early Years News

We are excited to be relaunching our outdoor playgroup, Lanchester Little'uns after half term. Sessions will run on Tuesday afternoons from 1:30 to 2:30pm. Little'uns is for children from two upwards who do not yet attend our Nursery. Children attending must be accompanied by an adult. If you are interested in a free place, please email us at: school.office@lanchesterep.net with your child's name and date of birth. We will be offering 15 places and in the first instance, priority will be given to children who will be starting with us after Christmas. Children who do not get a place initially will be added to our waiting list and you will be contacted as soon as a space becomes available.

Thank you to Reception parents who have shared their child's experiences of their first school reading book via Evidence Me. It has been wonderful to hear about the stories your children have been telling. We hope that you will find it easy to continue using Evidence Me as an alternative to a written reading diary. If you need any support in using Evidence Me, please ask your child's teacher.

We are looking forward to your child's autumn treasure hunt coming back into school so that we can display them. We hope your child has fun searching for treasures to share.
