Dear Parents／Carers，
We have enjoyed a wonderful week in school with some super children．It has just been really special to welcome so many more children back to school this week．I have been absolutely amazed with how well every single child has come into school so happily！I must also thank all parents for being really respectful of each other，so good at social distancing and particularly good at following the one－way system．Thank you very much！

However，can I please just ask all parents not to arrive early in a morning？Some parents are arriving almost 15 minutes early for their Bubble start time and it really is important that we keep these children separated from each other．We have been quite flexible this week，but after reviewing our systems that are in place，feel that we really must be quite strict in not admitting children early to try and prevent this from happening．The staggered start times are in place for a reason and we must keep to those．Thank you，once again，for your understanding．

As the week has progressed，so have the emails asking for places in the Bubbles．Unfortunately，we are unable to accept any more Reception children at the current time，but do still have a small number of spaces in Year 1 and Year 6．We have now opened the third bubble in Year 6 due to the high increase of numbers in this year group．We are hoping that most of Year 6 may choose to come back as the term draws to a close．This will enable them all to say goodbye to each other and have some closure on their time at our school．

## Government Announcement

Many of you will have heard the government announce last week that schools can open to more children in other year groups this term．Unfortunately，we will not be able to do this as we have not even been able to open to Nursery children which was one of the key year groups announced weeks ago．This is simply because of the limited space，staff and number of children already attending．This means that Nursery，Year 2，Year 3，Year 4 and Year 5 will not be back at school before September．

I realise that some of you will be disappointed by this．I actually cannot believe that I am receiving emails from parents wanting their children to come to school and I am having to say they can＇t．It really is just a bizarre situation we all find ourselves in．

However，recent announcements seem to imply that all children will be back in September．Obviously，we have no further information about this－we find out everything at the same time as you！But it would be lovely to be able to welcome all children back to some kind of＇normality＇at the start of the new academic year．

With this in mind，we have decided to have two training days at the start of next year which means that the children will not return to school until Thursday $3^{\text {rd }}$ September－a day later than previously planned．This is simply to allow staff to plan a slightly amended curriculum due to the issues surrounding this term．

## End of Term and Year 6 and Nursery Leavers

It is important that our Nursery children（who transfer to a different primary school in September）and our Year 6 cohort have some closure on their time at our school－this is of particular importance for our Year 6 children，most of whom have been with us for over 7 years．

Therefore，with this in mind，we will be closing on Wednesday $15^{\text {th }}$ July for all children in Reception and Year 1．Key worker children will continue to attend until lunchtime on Friday $17^{\text {th }}$ July．

This will allow us to plan Leavers＇events for Nursery Leavers and Year 6 on Thursday $16^{\text {th }}$ July and for Year 6 on the morning of Friday $17^{\text {th }}$ July．We still do not know quite what this will be as it depends on announcements and guidelines in the coming weeks．We are hoping it might be possible to hold a socially distanced graduation ceremony for Nursery
and leavers' service and assembly for Year 6 on the school field. However, we still do not know if this is allowed. Even if this is not possible though, we will plan something with the children. We will continue to update you weekly about this but please bear with us. Due to the circumstances, we just cannot make too many plans too early - we need to wait to see what is allowed by the middle of July.

## Staffing for September

We have had some lengthy discussions about September and have made the decision that it is important to bring this academic year to a natural end and prepare for a new start and academic year in September. When organising staffing for September, we have, where possible, ensured that teaching assistants move up with the children to provide some continuity for them all.

## Transition

It is going to be important for all children to 'meet' their new teacher this term, even though for most, this will just be a virtual meeting. So, in the penultimate week of term, the children will have a Zoom meeting with both their current teacher and their new teacher. Then, in the final week of term, the children will have a Zoom meeting with their new teacher. There will also be some work we ask the children to complete at home to help their teacher to get to know them.

However, please do not worry about September. We know that most children will not have been in school for almost 6 months. When we return, we are aware that some children may be anxious and it will take time for them all to settle and get into their new routine. We will be prepared for that and all teachers are obviously very experienced in adapting their teaching to meet the needs of our children.

## Summer Closure

Some parents have been asking about Mr Graham's Holiday Club. Apologies, but this will not be taking place this summer. This is simply due to the issues surrounding Covid-19 and also the need for maintenance, repairs and building work to take place in school over the holidays.

## Zoom Calls

We will be holding more Zoom calls next week for the younger children in school. As usual, an email will be sent reminding you when the call will take place and then the link will be emailed to you half an hour before the call is due to take place. The children have loved seeing each other and the chatter and noise is just wonderful (I never thought I would hear myself say that - although the power to mute them all is immense!)
