Dear Parents/Carers,

I shall start this letter the same way as the last one. What a difference a week makes! This time though – in a negative way.

This should be the final communication of the school year – but something tells me that it won't be! However, it is the final weekly letter of what has turned out to be quite some year. I think last academic year was just the warm up for the marathon that this academic year has turned out to be.

I am not sure about you, but my head is spinning after this week and you must all dread seeing that tweet, Facebook post, text or email. I cannot even begin to think about the impact this half-term has had on you all as parents – those trying to work, juggle siblings, care for pre-school children, organise childcare... the list goes on.

I don't know whether it is any comfort, but we are not alone in this – Covid-19 has swept through many schools in the North-East in the last few weeks. I do think that the 3 days we were closed did help to break the cycle, but sadly, it was only a matter of time before it would begin again.

Obviously, I am sure you will have heard the news this week that from September, the bubbles in schools are to be scrapped. From 16th August, only the child/adult testing positive will need to isolate and other close contacts will not so this should, in theory, help avoid the chaos of the last few weeks. However, I have not had any further information as to how this will work in schools and what, if any, other things will be put in place to support this new approach. I have a feeling this will come out in the middle of the school holidays for us to put into place for September.

This week has caused a total roller-coaster of emotions with so many positive lateral flow tests and a mixture of positive and negative PCR tests. It is so tough for classes and year groups who have to isolate – it is just totally miserable. But the highlight of my week was being able to tell Year 6 parents and staff that they could return to school – I am not sure who was happier – the children, parents or staff! It is just so imperative that our Year 6 can enjoy their last few days together and we just want to be able to send them off in true E.P. style too!

However, I am absolutely devastated from a personal perspective, that I will not be able to play a part in the final days with our wonderful Year 6 cohort. I have to isolate until midnight on Friday and am totally gutted that I will not be able to share in these final, special days with Year 6 after spending so much time with them over the last 7 - 8 years. I will be with them all in spirit, though and will participate in some way in their leavers' events. This, for me though, really is the final straw in what has been the toughest year ever!

Staff Departures

Next week is the final week for two of our staff. Mrs Janette Marklew is retiring from her role as our Business Manager after 9 years with us. I know she is very much looking forward to the next stage in her life but that she will miss everyone in our school community. She has dedicated so much of her life to supporting schools, including ours, and especially after this last year, is ready for a more steady pace of life!

Miss Amy Watchman has also finished her apprenticeship with us and is moving onto a new Teaching Assistant role in another school. She started with us just prior to the lockdown last March so has certainly had an eventful 18 months with us! We wish her all the very best as she starts out in her career.

School Dinner Information for September

This is a reminder to all parents of Year 2 children that once they start Year 3, dinners are no longer free of charge (unless you are eligible for Free School Meals due to a low income) and they will have to be paid for from September. The cost of school meals have gone up from September to: £2.15 per day – a total of £10.75 per week. This can all be paid on ParentPay and we ask that they are paid for at least one week in advance. If your child is currently on school meals but would like a packed lunch from September, please email the school office so that we do not charge you for meals that are not take. Thank you for your help with this matter.

Monday 12th July 2021 – Registers to Remain Open until 10am

We are all very aware that England are playing in the final of the Euros on Sunday evening and that this is the biggest match in most of our lifetimes (even mine!) and certainly that of the children. We realise that many of our children will be staying up to watch the match on Sunday evening and may feel slightly tired on Monday morning. The staff are aware of this and will be expecting some tired children in school on Monday!

We will also hold the registers open until 10am on Monday so that children can sleep in slightly later on Monday morning if needed. It has been 55 years since the last time there was a match as big as this and it might be another 55 years until it happens again!

However, do not worry – all the staff will be in school for the normal time as I also expect many children to arrive for the usual school start time. Please note – Year 6 MUST be in school at the normal time as their buses will be leaving promptly for their walk. However, they can all sleep on the bus on the way up there!

Monday 12th July - Year 6 Walk

Year 6 will enjoy a day at Bamburgh and Seahouses on Monday and will leave at 9.15am and return for 5pm. This is always a highlight of the school year and whilst it will only be their year group this year, I am sure they will all still have a wonderful time. They will need to be dressed appropriately for a walk and the beach, will need a packed lunch, plenty of fluids, waterproof, sun hat and sun cream. As mentioned previously, this is only for the children and staff this year. Sadly, we do not feel it is appropriate to have parents join us on this occasion due to the current situation.

Wednesday 14th July – Moving Up Session

This is going to look very different this year as we are unable to have children move classrooms or have a session with their new teacher as this jeopardises the bubbles. So, what we are doing instead is having an outdoor session where the children will meet their teacher and they will also have a virtual tour of their new classroom.

Children who are isolating at home will have a Zoom meeting with their new teacher in their new classroom so that they do not miss out on this important event either. The children will be told on Monday when these Zoom sessions will take place – this is only for those who are isolating.

COVID-19 Information

The symptoms for this virus have changed slightly and if you or your child have any sign of a cough, cold, headache, fever, or loss of smell or taste – they MUST go for a PCR test. You can book this either online: www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test-or-calling-119. Reminder: If your child displays any of the key symptoms of COVID-19 whilst they are in school you will be contacted to come and collect them and they will not be able to come back into school until they have a negative PCR test result or have completed their period of isolation (if they get a positive result). If your child has siblings, they will also need to be collected at the same time.

If your child has COVID-19 symptoms at home or needs to isolate, please make sure you let the school office know either via email or on the absence line. Likewise, if a child tests positive on an evening or during a weekend, please email Mrs Davis on <u>j.davis@lanchesterep.net</u> with the email subject 'COVID-19 Positive Result' and include your child's name and class group in the email text.
