Pupil Premium Expenditure 2015 – 2016

Pupil Premium is additional funding for schools to help improve both the attainment and progress of some groups of pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. These groups of pupils are:

- Pupils receiving free school meals or who have done so at any time in the previous six years
- Pupils who are looked after or recently adopted from care
- Pupils who have a parent in the armed forces

Raise the attainment and Achievement of pupils so that children make *at least good progress* and close the gap enabling pupils to reach their full potential.

Support in 2015/2016

At Lanchester E.P. School we want to provide all children with a range of activities that they might not always have access to. We provide a wide variety of activities that enhance their education and well-being such as theatre visits, school walks to the seaside, visitors into school and many of these are subsidised. We also support learning through programmes delivered to individuals or small groups of children.

We have used the funding received from Pupil Premium in 2015/2016 in the following ways:

- Employed additional teachers and teaching assistants for morning sessions to provide focused group teaching to ensure attainment in Mathematics and English is high and that pupils reach their full potential.
- Increased the number of teaching assistants to provide social and emotional support/interventions to ensure good attendance and increased levels of confidence and self-esteem.
- Increased the number of teaching assistant hours during afternoon sessions to provide increased targeted support in Phonics, Reading, Writing and Maths.
- Provided small group booster support for Year 6
- Supported reading through subscribing to Lexia and Bug Club at both school and home.
- Subsidised enhanced learning opportunities such as educational visits, residentials, theatre trips, whole school walk and music tuition to support holistic learning and development
- Purchased ICT equipment and software
- Provided free Breakfast Club places
- Continued provision of daily milk past the age of 5 years

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

- Improved progress and attainment of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium in the Foundation Stage. In 2016 there was an increase of 50% of PP children who achieved a GLD compared to the previous year.
- At the end of KS1, PP children out-performed Non PP children by 16% in Reading and 1% in Writing. In Maths, PP children were only 6% lower that non PP children.
- At the end of KS2, there was a gap this year between the attainment of PP children and non PP children. These figures have been affected by mobility during the final two years in KS2. This remains a priority in 2016 2017.
