Year 6 will continue to be split into two classes for the morning sessions and will come back together again as one class for most afternoons as it has been for the latter half of this year. Whilst they will have new 'registration' teachers, the children will be set every morning for Maths and English. So whilst your child may be transferring to one registration teacher as stated here, they may not actually be taught by that teacher. At the end of this academic year, the staff will be meeting to discuss which group every child should be taught in in the morning sessions. Mr Wilson also teaches Maths to a small group of very able mathematicians. We have worked in this way for the last three years and it has proved to be very successful so intend to continue with the same organisation for next year.

Mrs Sant and Mrs Coyle will share responsibility for their class with Mrs Sant teaching Maths and English every morning and Mrs Coyle teaching the foundation subjects every afternoon.

School Walk and Beach Day



I think the children are becoming really excited about our school walk and beach day next week on Tuesday 18th June. To many children in our school, this is most definitely the highlight of their year which is just lovely! The weather forecast is currently looking very good, especially considering the weather we have had this week! Please remember that all children need a packed lunch for the day, plenty of drinks and sensible clothing (bearing in mind the weather up there can be very different to here!). School uniform is not needed.

This year, we are organising things slightly differently for our Reception children. They are going to do a shorter walk on the beach to allow them more time to spend on the beach, building sandcastles and playing in the dunes on their own, before the rest of the school joins them for lunch. Their bus will take them straight to Bamburgh where they will go to the toilet before walking through the dunes onto the beach.

Please remember that we do not return until 5 pm on that day and the children will be dismissed in the same way as any other day, NOT from the bus. We need to be sure that all children are dismissed to a parent/carer so please come onto the top yard for approximately 5 pm where your child will be dismissed from the usual place. However, we are unable to predict the traffic in advance, so please keep an eye on twitter where any updated arrival times will be posted.

We are, once again full on the buses for parents. Thank you all for your help. It makes a big difference to the day and allows us to have much smaller groups. We do have a waiting list for bus places or some parents do drive up there and join us for the walk. Please note, dogs are not allowed to accompany us due to health and safety reasons. It is always so lovely to see an increasing number of parents joining us for a lovely, family day out and it does help our organisation of the day (which is challenging!) so thank you all. However, please remember that all children must return with us on the buses as otherwise it becomes a logistical nightmare!

On the morning of the walk, we would appreciate it if all parents accompanying us on the trip could make their way to the Junior Hall where I will talk about the organisation and expectations of the day before you join the appropriate classes.

Please note, we will be keeping a very careful eye on the forecast. In the past, when the weather has been changeable, we have been asked to make a decision regarding whether the walk will actually take place or not, the day before to help parents who have taken the day off work. Whilst I understand that this is useful for working parents, sometimes it is just not possible to make the decision before the day itself. The only time a decision to cancel will be made in advance of the day is when we are in a period of low pressure and the forecast is for very heavy rain. In all other cases, we will wait and see what the day brings.

However, if the walk does have to be cancelled due to the weather, we will organise alternative, fun activities in school for the children to enjoy throughout the day, as we have had in the past.

Parents' Evening



This year, we are holding a drop in session on the final Monday of the school year – Monday 15th July from 4pm until 6pm. This will allow parents and carers the opportunity to discuss any issues you have arising from your child's end of year reports which will

have been given out on the previous Friday. We find holding 'normal' parents' evenings at this time of year just means that teachers are repeating everything that is written in the school report and this has been very successful in the past.

No appointments are necessary for this drop in session – just come along at any time during the two hours to see your child's class teacher. However, if you are happy with your child's report and you have no comments or issues, obviously there is no need to come along to this evening.

As we approach the end of the year I would strongly encourage you all, and especially the Year 6 parents, to check your ParentPay balances. Please adjust your payments accordingly for Dinner Money and Wrap Around Care to ensure that your accounts are at £0.00 for the end of the year.

I would encourage you all to pay for dinner money and any wrap around care sessions at least a week in advance to ensure that your account is always up to date.



Foundation Stage News and Trips



We are looking forward to our Nursery trips next week. On Monday 17th June, our Giraffes, Monday-Wednesday Flamingos and the Penguin Group are going on their trip to Roker Beach and Park. On Friday 21st June, our Zebras, Wednesday to Friday Flamingos and Meerkats are on their trip. Please note that for children not attending the trip, Nursery will be closed as all staff will be accompanying children. This means there is no session on Monday for Meerkats or Zebras and no session on Friday for Giraffes or Penguins.

On trip days, we would like everyone to come to Nursery for 9am please when a briefing session will take place for adults accompanying us on the trip before the bus departs at 9.30am. All children will need a bag with a packed lunch, drink and a full change of clothes. They need to be dressed appropriately for the weather, ideally with a hat and wellies. Please remember to apply sunscreen and children are encouraged to bring a bucket and spade. They will not need spending money. The weather forecast looks promising for a wonderful day out! We will return to school by the end of the school day so any unaccompanied children should be collected from Nursery as normal.

This term, Mr McLoughlin's class have been trialling the Skoolbo website as a way of practising reading and sounds, rather than using Word Box Books. This has so far proved to be very successful and it has been great to see that lots of children have been trying hard to improve their scores. Using Skoolbo means that children can be stretched to read words based on their previous successes and can automatically revisit words that they might have found tricky. We are planning to use this with our Reception children next year and are very excited about how we can use this even more to improve learning. If anyone in Reception would like some information about how to access Skoolbo, please speak to Mr McLoughlin.

On Wednesday, we will be having a visit from Laura Bryant, the Reception teacher at All Saints, who is coming to visit the children who will be starting with them in September. She is very much looking forward to getting to know your children!

Please note that on the day of the whole school walk (next Tuesday 18th), there will be no main school after-school club, so any Nursery children staying for After School Club will need to be collected by 4.30pm. Thank you.



Go Givers Project



Thank you so much for your textile donations. We managed to collect almost 300kg of textiles and raised £116. The Make a Difference Group have worked really hard over the last few weeks and we have been both shocked and fascinated by the facts and figures we have learned. The textile industry is responsible for a large proportion of the waste in our landfills but the discarded textiles also contribute to pollution of water supplies and have a huge carbon footprint. We have been learning about different ways we can recycle and upcycle our textiles to help reduce the amount we throw away.

We hope that our message is filtering through school and that everyone will consider a little more carefully before simply throwing something away. We are excited to be attending a presentation event in Durham on June 26th, where we will be sharing our findings with many other schools from the county.



Sports Days



The children are all looking forward to their sports days this term. On Wednesday 26th June, we have the two Foundation Stage Sports Days. Giraffes Monday – Wednesday, Flamingos, Meerkats and Mrs Burke's class will have their sports day at 9.30 am. At 2.00 pm, the Wednesday – Friday Flamingos, Zebras, Penguins and Mr McLoughlin's class will enjoy their sports day. Both events will be held on the main school field. Parents will gain access to the school field via the school gate.

Children are to come to school dressed in their sports gear ready for the day ahead! If they wish, Nursery parents can take their children home after the Sports Day has taken place. Equally, the children can also stay with us. Foundation Stage Sports Day is all about enjoyment of the activities. It is completely non-competitive and is about participation and having fun!

On Friday 5th July at 1.30 p.m. we have Sports Day for Years 1 - 6. Again, all parents are very welcome to join us and access to the school field will be via the field gate. Once again, sports day will be a carousel of activities when all children are put into teams consisting of all year groups. There will be competitive races at the end of sports day and heats will have taken place previously for the children.

The Friends of the School will be serving tea, coffee and soft drinks during the event – a huge thank you to them as I know so many of you really appreciate this!

As usual, we will be holding a parents' race as well. There will be two races – one for men and another for women – and it is a sprint race. Please note, that we cannot be held responsible for any injury sustained due to competing in this race... it does get rather competitive on that track! We will also be having a staff race which is equally as competitive and often needs Hawk-Eye to settle disputes! Mr Knighton and I have still not recovered from our defeat last year!

Ocean World



All children from Years 2 – 6 will be taking part in our musical extravaganza at the end of the summer term in Consett Empire Theatre. The whole school has a real buzz about this show with work taking place in every classroom around this theme, art work being completed, singing taking place in every classroom, children learning their narrations and the excitement and pride at being chosen to have one of the main roles.

On Thursday 11th July, we will be holding two performances of 'Ocean World' at 1.30pm and 6pm. On this day, all children in Years 2 – 6 will need a packed lunch as we will be going up to the Empire Theatre at 9am in the morning for our dress rehearsal and will stay there for lunch and the afternoon show. Children will then return to school to be collected and then will need to return to the Empire Theatre for 5.30pm in time for the evening performance.

Tickets for the show are £5 per person and this time, ALL tickets MUST be purchased from Consett Empire Theatre directly – they cannot allow us to sell the tickets ourselves due to their auditing regulations. So, in order to allow everyone time to purchase tickets, they will go on sale from Monday 24th June and initially, there will be a maximum of 3 tickets per person per show. From Friday 5th July there will be no limit on the number of tickets purchased. This just allows a little time for all parents/carers to buy their tickets. Tickets can be bought in person from the Empire itself (opening hours are Monday 10am – 3pm, Tuesday – Saturday 10am – 3pm and 6.30 – 9pm) or you can book online via their website or via telephone (there is a £2 booking fee via telephone and £2.50 online per transaction).

Each year group are taking different parts – some are turtles, others are dolphins whilst some are the creatures of coral, fishermen, polluters to name but a few! The children, as usual, are showing amazing talent and skill and we know this is going to be another wonderful and memorable event for them all.



End of Year Reports and Results



The staff are all very busy writing the children's end of year reports which will be given out on Friday 12th July 2019. At that time, Year 1 parents will find out whether their child has passed the phonics screening check, Year 2 parents will be given the end of key stage teaching assessments and Year 6 parents will receive the results of the SATs tests. While we do receive the test results earlier than that for Year 6, these are never shared with parents until the reports are given out and until we have had chance to go through the test papers to check for any errors. I am sure you will appreciate that this is quite a time-consuming task!



Summer Fair



Our very popular summer fair is being held on the final Saturday of term on Saturday 13th July between 11.00 am and 1.00 pm. This is always a lovely way to finish the year and is another lovely social event for young and old alike. I am sure that this year's event will be even bigger and better than last year's! We have a variety of stalls and activities for the children including fairground rides, (teacups and bouncy slide), penalty shootout game, some new side stalls (including a putting game, tic-tac-toe, hook-a-duck, tin-can alley, potty toss and bull ring toss), tombolas, pick-a-bottle, hot dogs, refreshments, ice creams and (weather permitting) a water slide. All we need is some dry, sunny weather!

In addition to all of these, we have our ever popular soak the teacher which the children just love!
