#### **Government Announcement for Year 2 and Year 6 Statutory SATs**

I am sure many of you will have heard the news this week about Year 2 and Year 6 Statutory Tests. Year 2 tests will be cancelled in 2021 and whilst the Reading and Maths tests will take place for Year 6, the GAPS test (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling) will be cancelled.

We do agree that this is absolutely the correct decision for our Year 2 children and had hoped the same decision might have been made for our Year 6 cohort. However, it makes no difference at all to our approach to teaching in any year group throughout this academic year.

I know that Mrs Grieve is feeling rather emotional as she faces her final week with us. She will certainly miss the children and I know how much we will all miss her. I do think she is looking forward to a quiet few weeks though – it will be the calm after the storm for her I think! We still hope that she will return occasionally next year when life resumes some kind of normality!

# **Final Week of Term**

We have thought very carefully about the final week of term with particular consideration around the Christmas Parties. Obviously, we all need to be more careful than usual to avoid the need to self-isolate over Christmas. None of you want that for your children and none of the adults in school want that to happen to them or the families either! Whilst it is still a possibility that this may happen, I do feel that we need to try to minimise the risk for the whole school community.

So, we have made the decision that where possible (and certainly indoors), all classes will work/play on their own during this final week. Whilst they have to remain as year group bubbles and have lunch and playtimes together, when outside, the children will be encouraged to only play with children from their own classes. In addition, we have made the decision to have the children's parties in their classes rather than the whole year group bubble. This way, we can minimise contact with others as much as possible and minimise the possibility of anyone having to self-isolate.

I also need to ask you all to follow all rules and guidelines very strictly during this time. We want every member of the school community to enjoy their Christmas break and we need to help each other do this by taking extra special care of each other and following all the rules.

## **Early Years News**

Our EYFS Christmas parties are coming up very soon  $-15^{th}$  December for Reception and  $16^{th}$  December for Nursery. Next week, your child will bring home a bag for their party food. This should be brought back into school with them on their party day with a few party treats for them to enjoy. We find that the children prefer to have something they know that they will enjoy and they are usually very excited to have their party tea with their friends. Please do not send in lots of food as they will still be having their school lunch and snack as usual. We will provide drinks for your child. If your child would like to come into school in their party clothes then they can, but please make sure they are comfortable and that they can still manage to access the toilets/outside play.

We are finding the end of the day in Nursery is unsettling for some of the children as they wait to be collected and we are conscious that we are losing valuable learning time for them when they are collected individually. In order to get the most out of their time with us, we are going to start to prepare the children in groups for their home times at 2:45pm, 3:00pm and 3:30pm.

From next week, we will end each group's session with a story and aim to dismiss them all in groups. It is essential that we know which pickup time you will be arriving for and that this is kept consistent. Staff will not be able to answer the doorbell at different times as they are needed in Nursery to work with the remaining children. This will be especially important moving forward as our numbers will go up in January and we need to keep our correct staff: child ratios in the Nursery.

When you arrive at 2:45pm or 3:00pm, please bypass the queue for the Reception class and queue down the Nursery path until our door is opened. If you have other family members collecting children, please pass this message on as we do not wish to cause offence by not answering the doorbell out of allotted collection times. We hope you understand that we are not being difficult, but are trying to support the children to get the most out of their day with us. Thank you for your support.

#### Santa is coming to Lanchester!

Santa has found time in his busy schedule to pay a visit to the children of Lanchester. He will be walking around the streets of our village on Saturday afternoon from 1pm with the Lanchester Partnership elves, giving out gifts to the children. Full details of the route and approximate timings are on the Facebook event, just search 'Santa is coming to Lanchester' on Facebook.

Unfortunately, Santa won't be able to talk to the children or stop for photos as he has a very busy schedule (and even Santa has to maintain social distancing!).

All gifts will be wrapped and quarantined before the day and the elves will wear masks and use hand sanitiser regularly. Please help by keeping children within your own garden or on your doorstep; the elves will take gifts to them.

If Santa isn't passing your house please walk to the nearest point on his route, stay in your family group or bubble and maintain social distancing.

## **COVID Reminder**

If you or your child experiences any of the three following symptoms:

- a new, continuous cough
- loss of taste or smell
- high temperature

you must isolate all people in your household and book a COVID test. Your child will not be able to come into school until you have received a negative test result.

Please inform the office via email (<a href="school.office@lanchesterep.net">school.office@lanchesterep.net</a>) or via the absence reporting line if your child is going to be absent for this reason and inform us whether it is your child or another family member who has symptoms. It is important we have this information for our daily report to the Department for Education and to give us notice that we may need to prepare to isolate a group of students in the event that your child tests positive.

Again, if your child receives a positive COVID result you must inform school as soon as possible by emailing <u>j.davis@lanchesterep.net</u> with 'Positive COVID result' in the subject if it is on a weekend, or phoning the school on 01207520436 between 8.30am and 4.30pm during the school day.
