The Catholic Church

All Saints Parish Church

We do a Christingle service every year near Christmas where the Year 3's walk carefully around the church with oranges and candles whilst music plays softly in the background. Durham City



Durham Castle

Durham city was founded by a group of monks from Lindisfarne in 995AD. Durham is also famous for mining. The first ever Durham Miners Gala was held in 1871 and remains an annual event. Durham Cathedral was built in 1093AD and remains a centre for Christian worship today. Durham Castle was built by the Normans in the 11 century. It's never been breached! Durham Regatta has been held on the River Wear in Durham since 1834. Durham Regatta is a famous rowing race.
