
Year 3 Summer Term 1 - Parent Information <u>Traders and Raiders!</u>

We begin our topic with a journey back in time. Visit Jarrow Hall to experience what life was like during this time period. Learn about home life, farming and much, much more.


Who were the Anglo Saxons and where do the fit in our historical time line? What do we already know about the Anglo Saxons and what do we want to investigate?
