Tuesday 10th December – Year 6 in Newcastle

Our Year 6 children are looking forward to one of the highlights of their year! They will be enjoying a great day out, taking the coach to Durham, train to Newcastle, visiting Fenwick's Window before exploring the quayside, enjoying lunch in Uno's Pizzeria followed by the afternoon at the pantomime – Beauty and the Beast - at Newcastle Theatre Royal. I am sure they will all have a wonderful day!

Wednesday 11th December – Early Years Nativities

Our Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Nativity performances will be held in the Main School Hall on Wednesday 11th December at 10am and 2pm. The children in Leopards (Mr McLoughlin), Goldfish (Mrs Nash), Hedgehogs (Mrs Davis) and the Mon-Wed Robins (Mrs Moran) will take part in the morning performance. The children in Dolphins (Mr Osmond), Eagles (Miss Butler) and Wed-Fri and 30 hour Robins (Mrs Moran) will take part in the afternoon performance.

Children are welcome to dress up in Christmas themed clothes. These could be party clothes or they can come as characters from the Nativity. If your child is uncomfortable being dressed up, they can just come in normal non-uniform clothes. The Nativity performances in EYFS are planned as a relaxed, fun, singalong event, so please be prepared to join in! Please note, if you feel that your Nursery child needs to come home with you after their performance, please feel free to take them. The first time performing in a crowded hall can be a little overwhelming for some!

Wednesday 11th December – Choir Singing at Lanchester Garden Centre

Our choir are singing at 3pm at Lanchester Garden Centre on Wednesday 11th December in aid of Henry Dancer Days. We are hoping that parents/carers/families can transport the children there although we will do our best to ensure as many as possible are able to go as possible! The children should be collected from school at 2.40pm. Please do not come earlier as none of the choir will be able to leave school until the Early Years Nativity has finished. Siblings can also be taken at the same time. Please note, the children will not be returning to school – they can go straight home as soon as the performance is finished. If you have any questions at all about this, please just ask!

Thursday 12th December – Year 4 Trip

Our Year 4 children are visiting Jorvik Centre in York on Thursday. Please remember that they will be leaving school at 8:00am and will not return until 4pm. All children will need a packed lunch for the day and should wear warm, non-uniform clothes that are suitable for outdoor activities.

We are always very fortunate in being able to welcome New College Performing Arts students into school. This year, they are performing The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe for Year 2 – Year 6. Early Years News

For our Nativity performances next week, your child is welcome to wear Christmas clothing or Nativity costumes if they would like to. We are happy to help the children get changed if they prefer to come to school in uniform, and if they prefer to stay in uniform, that is fine too. We aim for our performances to be relaxed and joyful, but sometimes the noise and the crowd is too much for our little ones and they may prefer to be at the side with an adult, or to sit with you during the performance.

Next Friday we will send home a bag for your child to bring back on Party Day (Wednesday 18th) with some party treats to eat. We do this so that everybody has something they enjoy. Please don't feel the need to give them lots - those who stay all day will still have a lunch to eat too! We will provide drinks on Party Day. More information will come with the bag.
