# On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October – FootyAid Non-uniform Day

On Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October we are holding a FootyAid day when we will be asking the children to come to school dressed in their football kits (or non-uniform if you are like me and do not own such a thing!) in exchange for either £1 for our charity fundraiser or a bottle for the Pick the Bottle Stall at the EduFootyAid Family Fun Day on Saturday.

# Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> October – EduFootyAid Family Fun Day – 12pm until 5pm

EduFootyAid is a new charity football event raising money for Mind, the country's leading mental health charity. What makes EduFootyAid extra special is that all the players are primary school teachers.

It is set to be a bi-annual fixture with the first match taking place at our school on Saturday  $6^{th}$  October. Gates open at 12pm and kick-off is at 2pm. Every player is raising a minimum of £50 in sponsorship and overall the event hopes to raise £3,000. It is going to be a great family day, with a number of different stalls, raffle, face-painting, refreshments and fairground rides.

It is being organised by the Striker Boy campaign which was set up in memory of former primary school teacher Jonny Zucker, who sadly took his own life in 2016. Mental health is a key concern for the education sector, particularly primary education, with rates of suicide amongst primary school teachers nearly double the national average. Please come along and support this worthwhile event – it should be lots of fun for all the family.

#### **Reception 2019 Admissions**

If your child turns five between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2010 you need to apply for a school place (for whichever Primary School you would like them to attend) via <a href="http://www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions">http://www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</a>. Please note, if you want your child to attend Lanchester EP for Reception you must still apply for a place even if your child attends Nursery here. Applications opened on 12th September and close on 15th January 2019. Parents are advised to apply via this system and to not apply via a paper application form and the Local Authority have asked us not to accept any paper applications and send them in on parents' behalf.

We will be holding an Open Day on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> November – more details will follow on the half termly newsletter.

# Foundation Stage News (Nursery and Reception)

Thanks for your patience as we work out the best way to dismiss children at the end of sessions in Reception and Nursery. We hope you have found that it is easier to leave Reception at the end of the day via the corridor and the Nursery entrance. It seems to ease the congestion a little. We are also going to try dismissing the Morning Nursery from the outside area instead of them waiting indoors as we would much rather they were active and busy. Parents collecting children are welcome to come into Nursery to collect any of their child's belongings. Please note that the Nursery gate must be locked by 11.45 as staff are needed for lunchtime supervision in the hall.

Thank you for all your returned home assessment sheets. It has been really useful to see what your child is able to do for you at home and will help us to build a more complete picture of your child's needs and abilities.

Children come into Nursery and Reception ready to choose their activities each morning. You can support this by talking to your child on the way to school about what they might plan to do each day. Please note that from next week, Reception children will be able to go straight out into the middle yard to be active, just as the Nursery children go straight outside if they wish, so you can remind your child that this is also an option? Thank you.

Can we please remind you all to ensure your children's clothes, including coats, wellies and shoes are all clearly marked with their names? We often have duplicate pairs of wellies and shoes and this can be very confusing for the children. All children need a pair of wellies in school every day for outdoor play, so please try to ensure we have them in school. Thank you very much for your help and support – we really appreciate it.
