Dear Parents and Carers,

We welcomed over 100 people to our screening of the film and they all enjoyed their popcorn, hot dogs and hot chocolate. I would like to thank all of the Friends of the School for organising this event and helping to make it such a great success.

Our Christmas Fair, once again, was exceptionally well attended and it was lovely to see so many of you there. It just seems to get busier every year! We took £2,114 which is just magnificent in only two hours. Once the floats and expenses have been taken off, we anticipate that we will have raised around £1,700. The plan is that this money will be spent on further development of the outdoor environment.

Next week is going to be another very busy one with many different events taking place so please read the following carefully!

Monday 18th December 2017 – Key Stage One Nativity – 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

Year 1 and Year 2 are really looking forward to presenting 'Prickly Hay' on Monday. Their enthusiasm and talent in many areas has to be seen to be believed! Please note, the performances start at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. but we cannot open the doors until 9.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. due to the necessity of setting up the hall! All of Year 1 children are to bring jeans and a plain t-shirt to wear and Year 2 will be provided with their costume. We are following the same tradition of previous years with Year 2 taking the main parts and Year 1 supporting with the singing. I am sure you will just love this nativity!

Once again, we will all be gathering in the Junior Hall to enjoy some carol singing around the Christmas tree with hot chocolate, marshmallows and cream! All children MUST be accompanied by an adult. This is always a very popular and well-attended event. Come along and join us for carols, Christmas songs and the traditional singing of Away in a Manger by the children.

Thursday 21st December – KS2 Nativity and Christingle – 10 a.m. and 2.00 p.m.

KS2 nativities take place in All Saints Church and involve all children from Years 3-6. This is a wonderful way to finish our Christmas term and to send the children away with the real meaning of Christmas. During this service, our Year 6 children lead the nativity, Year 3 children lead the Christingle and Years 4 & 5 help with all the singing. This is a very special service and one which you won't want to miss.
