# **Reception 2019 Admissions**



If your child turns five between 1st September 2018 and 31st August 2019 you need to apply for a school place (for whichever Primary School you would like them to attend) via <a href="http://www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions">http://www.durham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</a>. Please note, if you want your child to attend our school for Reception, you must still apply for a place even if your child attends Nursery here. Applications opened on 12th September 2018 and close on 15th January 2019. Parents are advised to apply via this system and not to apply via a paper application form as the Local Authority have asked us not to accept any paper applications and send them in on parents' behalf.

#### Class DoJo – Behaviour Reward Scheme

It is lovely to hear so many 'pings' coming from all classrooms this half term. These noises come from ClassDoJo, which is used from Year 1 to Year 6 to reward the children for the great things they are doing in school. The children collect points for displaying positive behaviour and attitudes. One of the great things about ClassDoJo is that everyone's parents can also be connected, so that the positive behaviour can also be celebrated at home. Whilst ClassDoJo also provides a messaging service, we are not using that part of it and ask parents to email the class teachers instead. The children love this system and just seem to thrive on praise.

#### **Sports News**

We have had an incredibly busy start to the new school year on the sports front with so many different clubs and matches already started. This half term we have already had boys



and girls football matches and our netball team have also started their league campaign. In the next few weeks we will be travelling to different venues for the cross country competitions.

Our netball team had a great start to their campaign, winning one and drawing the other match this week. It was a friendly tournament for coaching workshops. We have three newcomers who were absolutely fabulous. #### **Athlete in School**



We are very excited to be welcoming top athlete Sally Scott to school on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October. Sally is a British Track and Field athlete and gained a Bronze medal in the Pole Vaulting competition in the 2014 Commonwealth

Games. Originally from Morpeth in Northumberland, she came fourth in the Olympic UK trials and has excelled nationally in her sport.

Sally will be leading a **sponsored fitness circuit with all pupils** and will follow-up with a talk and question and answer session. The aim of the event is to **inspire the pupils** to take up sport generally, but just as importantly to encourage them to discover and then pursue their **passion in life**.

This is a sponsored event and your child has been given a sponsorship form to help raise money for the event. As the sponsorship form explains, much of the money that is raised will be used to buy **sports equipment** for the school, while also **supporting GB athletes (including Paralympic athletes).** Please ensure that **sponsorship forms and money** are returned to the school office by Friday 12<sup>th</sup> October.

I am sure that this will be a very memorable and exciting day for all the children. (Please note – Nursery children will not be taking part in this event – they will have their own sponsored event in the summer term.)

#### Reading Week and Book Fair

We have our first Creativity Week coming up during the week beginning Monday 2<sup>nd</sup>
October when we hope to foster a love of reading with all our children. We have a
number of different activities during the week including a Book Fair in school, Play in a Day for both Year 4
classes, a coffee afternoon in aid of the MacMillan Appeal as well as a number of class-based activities too. I
am sure the children will make the most of the many and different reading opportunities during the week!

#### **Reading Shed and Bird Hide**

Sadly, both our Reading Shed and Bird Hide were vandalised during the summer holidays. We have never experienced any damage to school property like this before and were very upset to discover the destruction on two occasions during the summer holiday. However, our caretaker and groundsman have worked very hard to restore both damaged areas and these are now in full use again with the children.

**Parking** Parking is an issue around many schools in England. However, our school has a particular problem in that over half of our families live outside the village and therefore have no choice but to drive to school. However, what all parents do have is a choice over where to park. I regularly receive complaints about inconsiderate parking by our parents. Some parents try to park as near to the school as possible and do not seem to mind whether that is on double yellow lines, the zig-zags, the path or the grass. By doing this, it appears that these parents do not care about the safety of our children. But to me, this is of paramount importance. I have seen for myself the most careless and irresponsible parking from some parents. We all care passionately about our children but it appears that this is not the case for some parents when it comes to parking and road safety.

Please consider not only whether it is legal and safe to park where you do, but also have some consideration for local residents. We pride ourselves on having good relationships with the local community but I regularly receive phone calls complaining about reckless and inconsiderate parking near the school.

Please remember that we have an agreement with Lanchester Social Club for any parents to park in their car park both when dropping off and picking children up from school. Also, sometimes the far side of the village is so much quieter.

Meanwhile, please think twice before parking irresponsibly or dangerously. If that means you are occasionaly late to collect your child, do not worry - we will never let any child go until their adult is there for them. I would also like to thank all those parents who do park carefully and respectfully every day.

# School Tuck Shop for Years 1-6



Our new School Council will shortly be having some training with Lisa from 'Fruit to Suit' in order to run this year's healthy tuck shop. The school council will soon have their own



roles for the tuck shop, such as finance managers and stock controllers. The tuck shop will sell a range of healthy drinks and snacks such as apple juice, spicy noodles and flavoured raisins. ### **On-line Safety Lessons**

Our Computing work this half term is all centred around on-line safety and ensuring our children know how to keep safe when they are online. This is a life skill and one which we need to tackle at all ages. All children, from Reception to Year 6, will be enjoying some



lessons and activities on this theme. On **Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> October** we would also urge as many parents as possible to come along to school at 9.15 am or 6 pm and enjoy a coffee while Mr Bailey delivers a parental Online Safety session. I am sure you will find this to be a very important and informative session as this is an area where all parents need to know as much as possible in order to help keep their children safe.

#### eSchools app

Our eSchools app is a great way of keeping up to date with what is going on in school. As soon as newsletters are published they are sent straight to the app. This enables you to know straight away our latest news and events without the chance of the letter being lost at the bottom of a school bag. eSchools also contains some important information on the class pages about what your child will be learning.

We also offer parents evening appointments via this app. You will be able to see clearly what dates and times are available that suit you. When your child starts school at Lanchester E.P., all parents are issued with a username and password for eSchools which is all you need to get started.

If at any point, you forget your username or password, please get in touch with the school office who can reissue the details. If you have any further questions, please just contact the school office.

#### **Parents' Evenings**

Our termly parents' evenings are being held during the last week of this half term – Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> October between 3.45 and 6 pm. The booking system will be on eSchools again and we will let you know nearer the time when the booking system opens. Nursery parents will have additional appointments, which will be confirmed closer to the time. This is always a very useful time to meet your child's teacher and to discuss how they have settled in, their targets and the plans for the year. We will look forward to welcoming you soon.

Last year was another good year in terms of attendance, with the whole school achieving 96.2% attendance, which is slightly down from 96.7% the previous year. We had another record number of 100% attendees for the whole school year - 35 children - which is a huge achievement. This really is something to be proud of, as research published by the Department of Education recognises the huge impact missing school can have on children's life chances – by promoting attendance at this young age we can really make a difference to children's achievements and wellbeing in later life.

Attendance will continue to be a priority in school and we will send individual attendance certificates to parents on a regular basis. However, if your child drops below 95% at any time in the school year, you may receive a letter bringing this to your attention. It is worth knowing that 95% attendance is only 10 days absence over the whole year. New legislation was brought out recently which means that a child with 90% attendance or below is classed as a persistent absentee which is something I am sure we all want to avoid. This is the equivalent to 20 days absence over the whole year.

#### **Residentials for Years 3 - 6**

We pride ourselves on providing a rich and varied curriculum and education for our children and exposing them to as many different opportunities as possible. I am delighted to inform you that we have a number of residential visits planned for all of our KS2 children next year.

Year 3 & 4 will be having an overnight stay at Birdoswald Roman Fort at the end of March to support their history work about life in Roman times during the spring term.

Year 6 are heading to the Midlands in two weeks time to visit our partner school in Tamworth, Warwickshire. They will visit Warwick Castle before arriving at Birchwood School in Tamworth. After spending an evening enjoying pizza and games, they will sleep in the school and head to Cadbury World in Birmingham on the Friday morning before heading back North on the Friday afternoon. This builds on the friendships started at the Bett Show in London and when their children visited our school last June.

Year 6 have a visit to Ford Castle at the end of February when they will enjoy spending time together, as well as challenging themselves with a number of different outdoor adventure activities. Team work and supporting each other are the two key objectives for them!

Year 5 & 6 also have the opportunity of spending a day in our partner school in Plouer sur Rance, Brittany, whilst also exploring St Malo, the aquarium and a childrens' theme park. This takes place at the end of June.

The final arrangements are still being made for this but a meeting will be held on Monday 8th October when further information will be available for both the Ford Castle and France residentials.

#### **School Bank**

Our school savings bank for children (run by Prince Bishops Community Bank) will be opening again at the beginning of October. For any new children, more information will be given out shortly by the Office, detailing how to join and start saving. We will inform you next week about how and where to bring your money.

#### #EduFootyAid

We are quite thrilled that such a high profile event will take place in our school on Saturday 6th October. #EduFootyAid is a new charity football event raising money for

Mind, the country's leading mental health charity. What makes #EduFootyAid extra special is that all the players are primary school teachers. It is set to be a bi-annual fixture with the first match taking place at our school on Saturday October 6th. Gates open at 12pm and kick-off is at 2pm. Every player is raising a minimum of £50 in sponsorship and overall the event hopes to raise £3,000.

It is being organised by the Striker Boy campaign which was set up in memory of former primary school teacher Jonny Zucker, who sadly took his own life in 2016. Mental health is a key concern for the education sector, particularly primary education, with rates of suicide amongst primary school teachers nearly double the national average.

Whilst the cause is very serious the will be a fun, family day which we hope will be well-attended. There will be fairground rides, refreshments including hot and cold food and drinks as well as the football match at 2pm. Come and see Mr Bailey, Mr Knighton, Mr Stephenson, Mr Mordue and Mr Graham in action amongst many other others! It is the North-East vs The Rest of the Country!

The event has attracted considerable sponsorship from many education businesses including the TES (Times Edcuational Supplement), The Literacy Shed and 2Simple — companies that many teachers will be very familiar with!

To show the school's support for such a worthwhile charity, we will be holding our very own 'FootyAid' Day in school on the Friday prior to the event taking place. We are asking all children to come to school in their football strips (or non-uniform) in exchange for £1 towards Mind charity. I am sure it will be a great occasion.

#### **School Teacher Training Centre**

I am delighted to inform you that our school has become a School Training Centre for students on both the BA Education and PGCE (Post Graduate Certificate in Education) courses from Durham University. We have worked with a number of different providers for many years and were approached by Durham University to take on this role. This will be mutually beneficial and I am sure both the children and staff will enjoy having a number of student teachers in school on a regular basis.

#### **Twitter**

Our number of Twitter followers continues to grow rapidly (1,143) and our pupils receive some amazing learning experiences via this platform. In the past few years we have interacted with authors such as Berlie Doherty (Street Child) and Francesca Simon (Horrid Henry), have spoken to Olympic Gold Medal winning athlete Denise Lewis and even had our writing viewed on-board the International Space Station by astronaut Tim Peake! The response from parents to our school Twitter account has also been very positive and we urge you to follow us: @lanchesterep.

By positively using social media in school, pupils are learning how to post correctly and how not to share personal information online. With this in mind can we please request that you **DO NOT NAME CHILDREN** when making comments on our school Twitter account. No individual child should be identifiable from images posted online and so it is important that names are not associated with these images. We love receiving your comments and photographs online, but request that you use generic terms such as my child, my son, my daughter etc. when commenting about specific children.

Your response to the twitter summer homework challenge was superb too – it is really lovely to see what your children are doing, even when on holiday. Thank you for engaging so brilliantly with it!

#### **Key Stage 2 Musical and Choir**
