New Reception Intake Evening

All places have been allocated for our Reception intake and, once again, our admission limit has been raised, this year to 60, to allow children to start their journey with us in

September. We do have a waiting list for our Reception cohort so please make sure that you accept your place as soon as possible. Letters will be going out to these families shortly inviting them to the New Reception Intake Evening which will take place on Tuesday 11th June at 6 pm.

Year 1 Phonics Screening

This takes place the week beginning Monday 10th June and means that it is essential for all

our Year 1 and Year 2 children to be in school during that week. The children will have no idea what is happening as it will just be like a normal lesson to them. However, it is a legal requirement that the children do complete this.

Parents' Evenings

This year, in response to your suggestions, we will once more hold a drop-in session on the final Monday of term to allow you to discuss your child's report in more detail. For the last two years we have held parents' evenings in June at the same time as your child's comprehensive end of year reports are being written and you have commented that staff end up saying the same things twice! So we will once again, trial a drop-in session on Monday 15th July 2019 to allow you to discuss any aspect of your child's school report.

School Walk

This is a really memorable day for everyone and we are hoping and praying for another lovely, sunny day this year on Tuesday 18th June 2019! As usual, the plan for our special day out is to walk from Seahouses to Bamburgh along the beach. We stop for lunch in the sand dunes when the children have the opportunity to make sandcastles, play in the dunes

<u>Year 4 START Project</u> Miss Jackson's Year 4 class have started a new START project in school. This is an Art project funded by Children and the Arts and delivered by Artichoke and OASES. To begin the project, the children enjoyed a very interesting visit to the Oriental Museum in Durham where they looked at four distinct cultures before completing a range of drama and art workshops based on these. The next activity is a visit to Hamsterley Forest where a range of art activities based on the surroundings will be completed.

Recycling



Ski Residential from a first-time dad's perspective!



Why am I here? Not the big question you understand, a rather more specific right now, sat on a chair lift several meters up in the air with snow blowing at the few exposed areas of my face, held in place by the sort of bar you'd typically find on a fairground ride while being steadily carried up the side of a mountain, type of a question to be exact.

The 'right' answer would no doubt be along the lines of wanting to partake in a special experience with my daughter, watch and help as she learned a new skill, and be a proud parent as over the course of a week she went from being unable to put a pair of ski-boots on to confidently heading off down a full slope with the rest of her group, all turning skilfully in a snaking line behind their instructor.

The 'true' answer would be a bit closer to trying to recapture my youth in a 'not-quite-mid-life-crisis' type of scenario. I hadn't skied for over 20 years and was hoping by the end of the week I'd be able to do a few trickier slopes. As it turns out, it is a bit like riding a bike – without the pedals and wheels – and it all came back a lot quicker than I had dared hope. The first day was exhilarating - and slightly terrifying at times. Although I think that was always the hook for me – it's just you (with a couple of planks on your feet) and 'nature', a chance to genuinely challenge yourself or move out of your comfort zone – certainly a far remove from my normal day to day desk job!

On the second afternoon I decided to tag along with my daughter's beginner group to see how they were getting on, and I was impressed, not just with how far they'd already got but also with how mentally strong they proved during the blizzard that hit during that session – I found it tough, they just kept going – I was amazed.

I joined them again the next afternoon and the next and stayed with them for the full last two days, because they were frankly inspiring. Oh, every so often one of them would still fall down, but as the week went on it was steadily less frequent and they were usually up without any help or instruction needed.

So as I was carried up the mountain on that last day, various joints rejoicing that all this exercise would soon be over, I came to an epiphany - while my original motives for coming on this trip were rather self-involved, the reason that I had truly enjoyed it so much was actually the real reason I should have been coming in the first place!

A huge thank you to Michael Cleverdon for this wonderful report which was written after his first ski residential with the school. He was one of nine parents who joined a group of 30 of us in the French Alps in March this year.

We plan to share some of the activities we have enjoyed, including singing some of our best loved songs for you. As always, all the family is invited to share in this with us. Sessions will run from 9.30 to 11am and 1.15 until 2.45pm.

Nursery's annual Family Trip to Roker Beach and Park will take place on Monday 17th June for Penguins, Giraffes and Mon-Wed Flamingos and Friday 21st June for Meerkats, Zebras and Wed-Fri Flamingos. Please note that due to all staff supporting on the trip, there will be no session on the Monday or Friday for children not coming on the trip. Further details will be available soon, but please think about coming along with your child on this lovely day out.

As the weather warms up, we need to think about protecting our children from the sun. Children who are with us all day should have sun protection applied before they come to school, but if you have given us permission, we can top up their sun protection during the day. We have Nivea SPF30 sun protection in both Nursery and Reception or if your child needs an alternative then we can apply a sun screen provided by you (clearly labelled, please). If you would like to donate 50p towards the cost of this, it would be greatly appreciated! Please ensure that your child also has a named hat, preferably with some neck coverage, to wear on very sunny days. We will do our best to offer areas of shade outside and keep your children hydrated on hot days. Of course, English summers are unpredictable, so please think of bringing a hooded jacket for cool days and showers, and of course, we still need all children to have wellies in school for messy outdoor play.

We are constantly looking for ways to enhance our learning environment and especially develop our outdoor area. If you have anything that you think may be helpful to us such as tools, plants, pots, seeds, gravel, pebbles, piping, offcuts of guttering, paving stones or tyres, please let us know! We are still hunting for an elusive rowing boat, so if anyone knows of one going free, please get in touch!!

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Attendance



Our whole school attendance is 95.85% at the moment which is slightly down on last year which was 96.28% at the same time. However, we do only have 19 pupils across the school who are classed as Persistent Absentees (with 90% attendance or lower) - this equates to only 0.05% of our pupils.

At this time of year, one of the main barriers to attendance is pupils taking holidays during term time. Government guidelines state that time off during term time can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances and holidays can only come under this definition at the discretion of the Head Teacher. However, whilst we will not be able to authorise most leave of absence requests, it is important that you still complete a holiday form so that school staff are aware of when your child will be absent. This is especially true if you think that the absence qualifies as exceptional circumstances, as holidays cannot be authorised retrospectively.

Also, it is worth noting that any holidays taken that last for 7 days or more and have not been authorised may be subject to a fixed penalty notice from the Local Authority, which starts at £60 per parent, per child.



Nursery 15 hour and 30 hour Provision

As most of you know, our Nursery provides both 15 hour and 30 hour provision for 3 and 4 year olds. Our Nursery is always exceptionally

popular and we are so lucky to have such a huge outdoor space that really enhances the learning opportunities we can offer to our children. Offers of places for September will be made in the next two weeks and 99% of parents will be offered their chosen times.

We do still have some spaces for September so please feel free to remind other parents of the fabulous resource we have on our doorstep here in the village. Applications are available from the office or to download from the website.

We are holding our Open Evening on Tuesday 18th June between 1.30 and 2.30pm. This is when the rest of the school are out on their school walk leaving the whole of the Early Years Unit for just our Nursery children. Therefore this is an ideal time for our new September starters to come for a visit with their parents/carers.



Open Morning

We are holding an Open Morning in our Nursery on Saturday 8th June between 10am and 12pm to allow parents/carers/families/grandparents to visit our setting and see what we

have on offer. Please tell your family and friends and come along to see what your child can get up to during their day with us! We look forward to seeing you there.
