

Please make sure you keep your ParentPay account up to date and that you regularly check your balances and keep your account in credit. If you have queries about your account, please contact the School Office.


Pupil Absences

Year 6 at Newcastle Theatre Royal





As you are aware, we have made the very difficult decision not to hold the traditional nativities in school due to the current situation. However, what we will be doing instead is recording different songs, productions and radio shows and sharing them all with you. We know it is not the same as being in the hall watching your child perform, but we just feel that it is still not worth the risk of welcoming large numbers of parents into the school building just yet.

Therefore, if your child does not usually stay for a school dinner but would like to stay for their Christmas Dinner, it is essential that you let the Office know and pay £2.15 (this charge only applies to pupils from Nusery and Years 3-6).

A separate form will go out and must be completed no later than **Monday 29th November**. We have disappointed children every year whose parents come to the Office too late to order their dinner. Obviously it is essential to have a cut-off point to be fair to everyone in school and we just cannot fit 'only one more child' in for dinner when so many parents are asking for a meal after the deadline. Therefore if your child does not normally stay for school dinner and you would like them to have Christmas Dinner, please adhere to the deadline of letting us know no later than Monday 29th November. Please note that this is only for pupils who stay for a full day, so will not be open to Nursery pupils who are only in for half days. Thank you!

We are excited to be welcoming Tiny Tweeties back into school on Tuesday 30th November to visit the Nursery children. This follows their visit for Reception in Oc-


tober, which was very much enjoyed by our older EYFS children. We hope to invite them back again in Spring Term to run a session for the children who attend Wednesday -Friday.
