Dear Parents and Carers,

It feels an awful long time since I have been able to write such a positive letter to you all! You may have realised how excited I was on Monday night by the typos in my Daily Davis Update Tweet! I really had no idea what to expect in the Prime Minister's announcement but am just so pleased and relieved that we are opening to all children — I hope you are too! I do think that they are so ready for socialising again, playing with their friends, having a good routine and just being back to some kind of normal. I think we can only hope and pray that none of us ever have to experience another lockdown!

Having said all that, I am sure many of you still have some anxieties about your children returning. Whilst we are all still living with coronavirus in our midst, we do have to be prepared for the fact that there may be a child or adult who tests positive in school, resulting in a bubble having to isolate for a period of time. This, whilst the likelihood is lessening all the time, is still a real possibility. We will be updating our risk assessments next week, deep cleaning the school in preparation for a full return and reverting back to all the systems we had in place during the Autumn term. This includes increased cleaning during the school day, the use of staggered starts and pick-ups and no mixing of bubbles. I will send out detailed reminders of all timings and the organisation in next week's letter though once I have had chance to find, read, internalize and action all the new guidelines.

Please also be reassured that on their return, we will be focusing on your children's emotional well-being and initially just ensuring that they are happy, settled and confident. We realise that some children will be feeling very anxious whilst others will just skip through the doors. We will be ready for them all!

We have a lovely, final week of remote learning planned for the children with both World Maths Day, World Book Day and a non-screen day on Friday to complete what we hope is the final week of remote learning!

I just cannot wait for a week on Monday and I can't stop smiling picturing all those happy, smiling faces racing through those gates! It has been so hard for everyone after finishing last term on such a real high of the Winter Wonderland and Christmas to return to this term of uncertainty and challenge. For the first time in almost a year, there is positivity, real hope and a sense of life returning to some kind of normality.

Promethean Panels

Appointment of Assistant Head Teacher

World Maths Day – Wednesday 3rd March

In addition, the school will close at 1pm to vulnerable and key worker children to allow the school to be deep cleaned and re-organised in preparation for everyone returning to school on the Monday morning.

I think what was obvious from the comments, is that you all have completely differing circumstances with different needs and it is an impossible task to be able to meet the needs of each and every family. Our governing body carried out some monitoring of our remote learning during the final week of the half term and were very impressed with the children, commenting on their engagement, ability and enjoyment of the lessons which was very good to hear!

Early Years News

In anticipation of welcoming back our EYFS children to Nursery and Reception, in the next few days we will be sending out a form via Evidence Me for you to complete to let us know about your child's current interests and any other information which might help us to settle them back in with us quickly. If there is anything you feel is especially important, then please email your child's teacher directly. Otherwise, you can send the completed form back into school when they return.

We are trying to build up our collection of imaginative play resources as we feel it is vital that the children engage in creative play with their friends after such a long time away from school. We would love you to look in your cupboards to see if you have anything which might add to our dressing up box or home corner equipment. We are looking for resources which will spark the imagination such as scarves, hats, bags, adult shoes, costume jewellery, small jackets, waistcoats etc. We are keen to make a move away from commercial dressing up costumes which can be stereotypical and may not encourage children to use their imagination as freely as possible. We are also always looking out for useful household items to enhance our domestic role play areas too, so if you have pots and pans, kitchen utensils or anything that you think could be useful, (we can make use of most things!) then please let us know.
