Dear Parents/Carers,

Pupil Progress Reports

Next week, your child will bring home a Progress Report which is a snapshot of their current attainment and attitude to learning. In the end of year questionnaires in the summer, a number of parents commented that they wanted more regular updates of how their child was progressing during the year. We hold formal parents' evenings 3 times per year and decided that it was appropriate to send pupil progress reports home at the end of the alternating half terms. This means that we will now hold parents' evenings in Autumn 1, Spring 1 and Summer 1 and you will receive the pupil progress reports in Autumn 2 and Spring 2 and the full end of year report in Summer 2. This means that you are receiving formal information on your child's attainment and progress every half term.

The reports will be given to children in an envelope to bring home next week. In addition to the Pupil Progress Report there will also be: Attendance Certificate, Accelerated Reader Parent Report and their Additional Support Plan (if they have one). We hope you find these useful. They also have some information on about how you can help to support your child with their learning at home. If you have any questions at all about these, please contact your child's class teacher and they will be able to explain them in more detail.

Attendance Certificates

You will all receive your child's latest attendance information with their progress reports next week. It is important that you understand that the DfE (Department of Education) have changed how schools have to mark non-attendance due to COVID. Whilst children are waiting for a PCR result, the absence is marked as an X, which does not have an impact on attendance. However, once a case of COVID has been confirmed, then we have to change the code to an I. This then does have an impact on attendance percentages. However, we can see on the register in school, when an illness is for COVID reasons and we would never penalise anyone whose child is absent for genuine reasons. The attendance certificate is just showing you your child's attendance. Whilst we understand there are many genuine reasons for your child to be absent from school, we do also have a duty to monitor every child's school attendance and to get in touch with parents when we feel their attendance is a cause for concern. We are not judging anyone - we are just doing our job - as is the Attendance Officer if she gets in touch with you as parents.

Early Years News

New Guidelines for Covid-19

We appreciate that you will already be aware that some national measures have been reintroduced in response to the emergence of a new COVID-19 variant, which is called Omicron. All individuals who have been identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, irrespective of vaccination status and age, will be contacted directly and required to self-isolate immediately and asked to book a PCR test.

There are still high numbers of children and young people in County Durham testing positive for COVID-19 and the highest case rates are in school age children. This is leading to spread of COVID-19 within families and into older age groups.

We have received recommendations from the Government and Durham County Council's Public Health team and are introducing the following measures to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission in school:

• The use of face coverings in communal areas for all adults – any parents visiting school should also wear a face covering if entering the school building too.

 \cdot PCR testing for all adults and pupils if they are a close contact of a positive case in their household. We are also suggesting Daily Lateral Flow Testing at home for 7 days for any adult or pupil in Key Stage 2 (Year 3) or above who is a household contact of a positive case. The testing of primary age pupils is at parental discretion however and is not compulsory. Testing should start from the day the household member has symptoms or if they don't have symptoms, from when they tested positive.

· Additional attention will be given to ventilation, cleaning and hand hygiene in school too.

LFD Testing advice

We would recommend you have a supply of LFD testing kits at home in the event you are requested to use them. You can order home testing kits to be delivered to your home here: www.gov.uk/order-coronavirusrapid-lateral-flow-tests, or you can collect LFD kits at Community Collect sites across the County. To find your nearest collection point please enter your post code here: maps.test-and-trace.nhs.uk If you pick up tests from a pharmacy, you may be asked for a 'collect code' this helps the NHS match your details to the tests. To get a 'collect code' please visit: test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/collect-lateralflow-kits. Please register the result of your home test at www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result What to do if your child develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) or tests positive for COVID-19

The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature and/or
- \cdot a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

If your child does develop symptoms, they should get a PCR test and remain at home at least until the result is known. Book a free PCR test at: www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. If positive, your child should isolate for 10 full days after their symptoms appeared. If you are concerned about your child's symptoms, you can seek advice from NHS 111 at 111.nhs.uk/ or by phoning 111.

If your child has a positive test result but does not have symptoms they should also stay at home and selfisolate for 10 full days from the date the positive test was taken. This isolation period will be extended if they go on to develop symptoms by counting 10 full days from the day following their symptom onset.
