Key Worker Children

Our school will remain open during the Easter holiday for children of key workers. However, as communicated before we closed, we can currently only accept children whose parents are both key workers or in the situation

maintain the health and safety of all those on site – both the children and the staff in charge. This decision has been made in consultation with the Local Authority and Chair of Governors due to the huge numbers of our parents who are key workers. It would just be impossible to be able to offer places to all children who have just one parent as a key worker. Also, it has been made quite clear by the government on a number of occasions, the safest place for all of us, is to stay at home.

I would like to say a huge thank you to all those key workers whose children have been attending school. Your children are a credit to you all and have been wonderful! Thank you also for keeping in close contact with me and letting me know which days they will be attending – that is a huge help to me when organising the staffing and lunches – thank you very much!

Free School Meals

We have had an increased number of emails from parents asking whether they are eligible for the Free School Meals Voucher Scheme which has been launched by the government this week.

If your child is eligible for free school meals, you will have received an email from us this week. Families who are eligible for Free School Meals undergo a check which is based on their annual household income. If you think you might be eligible for this (if your annual household income is below £7,400) please email myself or the school office with your National Insurance Number and Date of Birth and we can ask the Local Authority to carry out a check.

There is some confusion around the universal free school meals scheme which is for all children who are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 regardless of their household income. When these children are in school, they do receive a free school meal, even though their parents might in fact be millionaires! These children are not eligible for the voucher scheme. I do hope that helps to clarify things for you all.

Obviously we need to be very aware of online safety and the children may just need to be reminded that whatever they write can be seen by everyone in their class – and by their teacher – and by their headteacher too!
