Class Photographs

Your child should come home this week (it may be today) with a proof of their class photo that was taken by Phototronics last week in school. Inside there is a form to complete if you would like to order a copy. These will need to be completed and returned to school, either with your child or handed into the School Office. Please make sure that the order has your child's name on it and that all orders are sealed. We recommend paying either by cheque or with your card details. However, if you pay by cash please make sure that this is securely in the envelope with the order form. The school office does not check who has handed orders in or how they have been paid for - if money is not securely in an envelope with the order then you may not get your photograph order and there will be no way for you or us to trace/prove whether this amount was sent to the company - by suggesting you do not pay in cash we are trying to protect you and your money.

You will notice that the form provided with your photograph proof asks for you to provide your cards security number (otherwise known as the CVC code - the 3 digits on the back of your card). Part of the Visa rules state that merchants are not allowed to ask for this on a written form and writing this down can expose you to fraud. We have flagged this up with the company, along with the fact that the form they are using is outdated, but please be aware that you should not need to fill this information in.

New Reception Starters for September 2021

A letter will be sent to all parents of our new starters for September at the beginning of next week. The letter will include all the information you need for the New Starters Meeting, Transition Days and September. Please look out for this which will be sent via email. Thank you.

COVID-19 Information

Please remember that if your child displays any of the key symptoms of COVID-19 whilst they are in school (a high temperature/raised from what it usually is, a new and persistent cough, a loss or change in the sense of taste or smell) you will be contacted to come and collect them and they will not be able to come back into school until they have a negative PCR test result or have completed their period of isolation (if they get a positive result). If your child has siblings, they will also need to be collected at the same time.

Whilst we understand this may be frustrating, please remember that we are only doing our job and trying to keep the community safe. We are not medical professionals; we can only stick to the guidelines we have been given.

If your child has COVID-19 symptoms or needs to isolate, please make sure you let the school office know either via email or on the absence line – this information is important as whilst most of the time it is a false alarm, it enables us to be prepared if there ever was a case in school and we had to send other children or staff home. Likewise, if a child tests positive on an evening or during a weekend, please email Mrs Davis on <u>j.davis@lanchesterep.net</u> with the email subject 'COVID-19 Positive Result' and include your child's name and class group in the email text.
