### Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> December – Foundation Stage Nativities

Our youngest children are very excited about their nativity on Wednesday and I am sure you will know the songs almost as well as them by now! They are to come to school dressed in any Christmas themed clothes – this might be a character from the nativity story, or a party dress or Christmas jumper. Some children feel happier in their uniforms which is also absolutely fine! The doors will not be open until 9.30 am for the 10 o'clock performance and 1.30pm for the 2pm performance.

The 10am performance is for Mrs Riddell's class with Nursery Monday – Wednesday Flamingo Group, the Giraffes and the Meerkats. The 2pm performance is for Mrs Burke's class with Nursery Wednesday – Friday Flamingo group and the Penguins. Nursery children can either go home after their performance or are obviously welcome to stay for their full session. Mrs Burke's Reception class will be able to go home immediately after their afternoon performance. Please note however, we are unable to allow siblings to go home early.
