Dear Parents/Carers,

I cannot believe that this is the final weekly letter of the strangest school year ever. I feel quite emotional sitting writing this as, like you all, I have never experienced anything like the last few months and certainly hope we never have to go through anything like it again!

When I stood on the yard on Friday 20th March, saying goodbye to all the children, watching them walk out of the school grounds, there were a few things going through my mind. The first was simply the sad thought that our children's lives were going to change quite significantly for the near future and I wondered how many of them would have to face the reality of death for the first time... The second was simply wondering when we would see them all again. The confusion, anticipation, anxiety and uncertainty we were all facing at that point in time was tough. I am a fairly positive person but I never imagined for one moment that we would not see them as a whole school again before the summer.

I am disappointed that we have not been able to welcome all year groups back before the summer break. I am sorry for those families and children who have found it so tough being at home for such an extended period of time. I can only hope that the children start to appreciate the joys of school once more in September!

It has been wonderful is to be able to welcome back so many children from Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. This time of year is of particular importance for Year 6 and I am just thrilled that almost all children of the cohort will be in school for their final week. They are going to have a wonderful week with their teachers and even though their send-off will be different, it will be every bit as special and memorable for them.

I would just like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your amazing support during these last few months. I am sincere when I say that I think this time has helped to bring the school community even closer together and make it even stronger. Your communication with us has been first class and you have all worked miracles in supporting your children so well with their home-learning. I know many of you have found it incredibly tough, more or less impossible and very challenging – many of our staff have had the same issues! Yet I also hope, that there are elements of it that you have found to be very rewarding. Hopefully, the unexpected and additional time with your children and families – time you will never get back again – has meant that you have been able to enjoy some special activities and moments that will remain in your memory banks for years to come.

School Uniform

Please do not forget that all uniform is to be ordered from Moette, our suppliers who are based in Langley Park. To make any orders, just click on the following link: <u>www.moette.co.uk/oc1/Lanchester-EP-School</u>. Alternatively, you can pop into their shop: Moette Ltd., The Old Chapel, Quebec Street, Langley Park. DH7 9XA. They are usually very quick and efficient, but please do not leave your orders too late – they do suggest you order prior to the summer holidays beginning. Current Reception children will need a PE t-shirt in their team colour for the beginning of Year 1. Please remember to include this in your order. They will need this for the beginning of the new year.

School Meals from September

From September, School Meals for pupils in Nursery, Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 will be increasing in price to £2.10 per day, which means a week's dinners will now cost £10.50. Meals for those in Reception, Year 1 & 2 will still be free. *Pupils moving from Year 2 into Year 3 will need to pay for their dinners in September unless they are entitled to Free School Meals.*

If you think you may be entitled to Free School Meals and haven't applied, or your circumstances have changed, please email the School Office for a form for us to do a check with Durham County Council.

If your child is moving from School Meals to Packed Lunches in September, please email the School Office, or you may be charged. Likewise, if your child is moving to School Meals, please email the School Office, and fill in the menu on the link that was sent out at the beginning of this week. Please fill in the menu as soon as possible so we can prepare what we need to order for when the children return in September.

Arrangements for September

I am sure many of you are wondering what the arrangements will be for our return in September. All children must return to school as the government have made it quite clear that there is not a choice for the new academic year. However, obviously there are many considerations when we have over 400 children arriving and leaving the school site within a very short period of time. On Monday, we will send you a letter detailing our plans. These are still being discussed and finalised in line with a new risk assessment.

PGL Refunds for Year 6 Parents

All Year 6 parents will have had their refund paid back into their ParentPay account. Please check this has been credited to your account. The residential has been deferred for the Year 5 children and Year 4 parents will also be given the opportunity in the new academic year to sign their children up for this trip too.

Ski Residential Refunds

These refunds should be credited to our account during the first week of August. However, as our account is a two-signatory account, it may be the middle of August before the refunds can be returned to your accounts. I will email you for your bank details so this can be transferred as soon as possible.

We have made a provisional booking for next year's ski trip: 6th - 13th March 2021. We will be discussing this with the company on our return in September and if this trip goes ahead, it will be open for any parents/carers and children in Years 4-6.

School Holidays and Term Dates 2020 - 2021

I am sure that many of you will have had holidays cancelled or postponed and will be considering when these can be re-booked for next year. It is really important to remember that holidays during term times can only be authorised in very exceptional circumstances. Very few holidays are ever authorised and this is likely to be even lower next year. It is going to be essential for ALL children to be in school as much as possible due to the extended closure of schools during the latter half of this year. Please also bear in mind that if you do decide to take a holiday during term time which has not been authorised, if your child is out of school for more than 7 consecutive days you can be fined - £60 per parent for each child.
