Dear Parents and Carers,

What a miserable week it has been weather wise – although in school itself, it has been one of the sunniest! I have had the privilege of spending time in all Key Stage 2 classrooms this week and have been so impressed with our children. Their attitude, resilience, behaviour and enthusiasm has been first class and I am so proud of them all. This was followed by a fabulous Outdoor Learning Day yesterday – to see the children so totally absorbed in their learning outdoors was very special.

We will be building upon our outdoor learning education and are beginning to introduce weekly Forest School sessions throughout the school. Next Wednesday it will be the turn of our Year 1 children but this will increase as the weeks progress. Exciting times ahead for our children!

#### Staffing

I have some bittersweet news regarding staffing in school. Mr Mordue will be leaving us at the end of this term as he has been successful in securing the Deputy Headship of Bishop Ian Ramsey CofE Primary School in Medomsley. Whilst we are all delighted for him, obviously we will be very sorry to see him leave our school. He has been with us for seven years and has been an invaluable teacher and member of our Senior Leadership Team during his time here. However, he more than deserves this promotion and I know he will do an excellent job in his new school – they are certainly very lucky to have him joining their team.

This obviously leaves us with a bit of a problem with Mr Mordue's teaching commitment in Year 6. After much thought and discussion with the governors, we have decided that the best solution for the whole school is that from January, Mr Taylor will teach Year 6 for the remainder of the year, Mrs Sant will teach full-time in Year 4 and Mrs Coyle will take over full-time teaching in Mr Taylor's class.

Obviously it is not ideal changing teachers in the middle of a school year. However, there are times when circumstances are just beyond our control. Year 6 is a crucial year in a primary school and Mr Taylor has over 5 years of teaching experience in Year 6 so he is the obvious solution to the problem.

I do realise that this may cause some concern to Mr Taylor's parents. However, you have my reassurance that your children will actually benefit in the long term because whilst they will now have a change of teacher in Mrs Coyle for two terms, they will once again have Mr Taylor as their teacher in Year 6 for the whole year.

In January we will be advertising a Senior Leadership post for September 2020 to replace Mr Mordue permanently.

The Leopards will go on their trip with Mr McLoughlin and Mrs Davis. Children will need to come wearing uniform and comfortable, preferably waterproof footwear. If the forecast looks rainy, we will put all-weather suits on the children, but if your child would prefer to wear their own then please send them wearing it. Children will need to bring a packed lunch which they will carry themselves, so a backpack would be ideal if they have one. We will be catching a bus at 9.30am so please ensure that your child is in school promptly by 9 am at the latest. If you have offered to come along to help, then please make sure that you are in school ready for a briefing at 8.45am on the day of your child's trip.

## Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> November – Mr Taylor's Class at Durham Lumiere 4.30pm- 6.30pm

Mr Taylor's Year 5 class took part in the Start Programme whilst they were in Year 4. This project has been delivered by Artichoke and OASES. To end the project, they have been invited to a 'Behind the Scenes Visit' to the Lumiere in Durham. The visit will focus on 'For the Birds' which includes 20 installations in Durham University Botanic Gardens. The bottle chandeliers, which the children made in a workshop in the Summer Term, will also be nearby, so the children will get to see their own artwork on display. They will need to remember warm clothing (including a waterproof jacket) and warm footwear e.g. wellies with thick socks or sturdy boots. The staff accompanying the children on this visit will be Miss Jackson, Mr Taylor, Mrs Grieve and Mrs Boyd. Please ensure your child's permission slip and photo consent is handed into the office no later than Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November.
