Dear Parents/Carers,

Well, it is the end of another week and with it, more announcements from the government about education! We are still processing the very detailed guidance that was published yesterday about our return to 'normal' in September. However, the main headline is that every child will return to school full-time in September.

The senior leadership team will need to sit down next week and work out the details for what that means for our school and then the whole staff team need time to discuss and digest it. Following this, we will share our plans with you all. However, I hope you know that we want your children back as much as you do! We now just need to ensure that we do it as safely as possible.

We understand that some children may be feeling rather anxious about their return to school and many of you have concerns that your child may have fallen behind academically. Please be reassured that our main aim in September will be to settle the children in, reassure them and then initially, we will be working on their basic skills. The majority of children will not have been in school for almost 6 months by the time they return.

However, having had some partial year groups in school for the last 2 weeks, we know how quickly the children settle back into a routine and are just back to their normal, happy little selves within hours! We cannot wait to have them all back and return to some sort of 'normality'.

Transition Arrangements

We understand that all children need some kind of closure to this very different year. With this in mind, we have Zoom calls next week with both your child's current teacher and their new class teacher.

Please make every effort for your child to be on their Zoom call next week. The times for all the different classes are below – their current class teacher as well as their new class teacher will be on these calls. The following week, there will be a further Zoom call just with their new class teacher. Please also look at the tasks we are setting for next week – the English one will be of particular importance for successful transition to their new teacher.

We will be running a Twitter competition for these activities — one winner will be chosen from each class and they will receive a children's cookery book. To enter, please post your child's nutritious creations on Twitter (with their initials and their Year Group) and the staff will judge them. Unfortunately, we won't be able to taste their marvellous work — so we will be judging on how creative they have been and how their work is presented!

The children can complete as many activities as they like and they can keep a record of their work in their home learning book. They could take photos, write up a recipe or carry out a taste review! Good luck and enjoy!

Oh The Places You'll Go!

For our English activities next week, the children will be building up to completing some form of autobiography about themselves for their next class teacher. As we have not had the opportunity to organise our transition days this year, we thought it would be a lovely idea for each child to provide some information and interesting facts about themselves. This will help their new teachers to get to know them a little more. Depending upon the age of your child, they will complete activities such as a written autobiography, an 'all about me' poster, a short picture book, a poem and so on. The children will need to provide some key information about themselves - hobbies, interests, favourite colours, favourite food etc. We will be using a range of books and short stories to stimulate the children's ideas, including, 'What Makes Me Me?,' 'All About Me,' 'My Book About Me,' and 'Oh The Places You'll Go.' The staff are really looking forward to finding out about the children in their new classes.

Belongings, P.E. Kits and End of Year Reports

We know that some children left various items of their belongings in school when we closed in March. The staff will be spending time next week, sorting out all the trays, cloakrooms, P.E. kits and classrooms and bagging up all items belonging to the children. These can all be collected from school.

The staff have, as usual, written an end of year school report. These can also be collected at the same time. We will endeavour to ensure the teaching staff are also outside at these times so that they can say goodbye to the children. However, please remember that we have no members of staff leaving this year, so even though the children will have a new class teacher in September, this year's teachers will still be around for a long time to come (I hope!)When the school closed in March, we never imagined that the classes would not be back together again this year so I do think it is important for the children to be able to have some closure on this school year and we hope that this will allow them to say goodbye in the most positive way we can at the moment.
